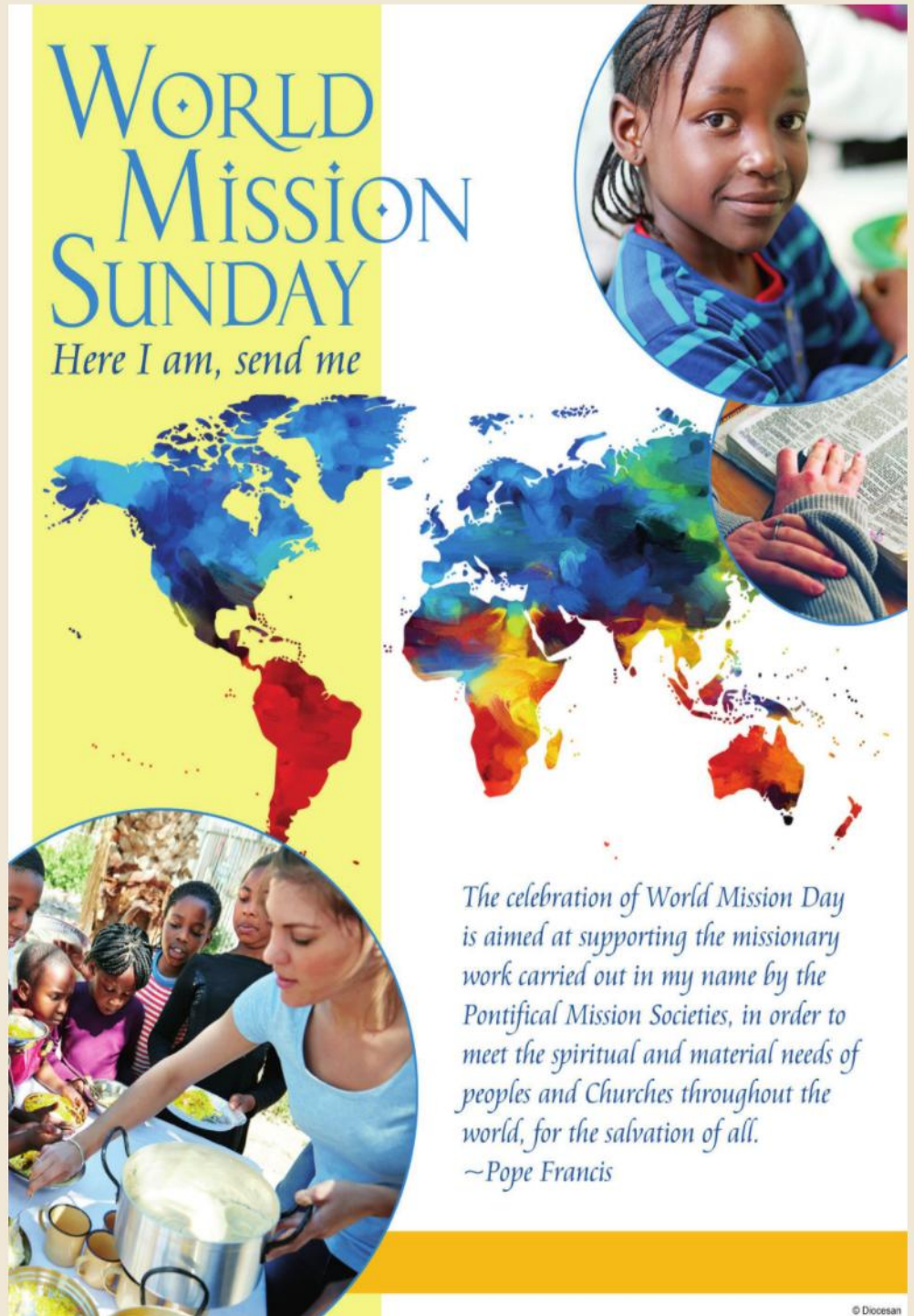

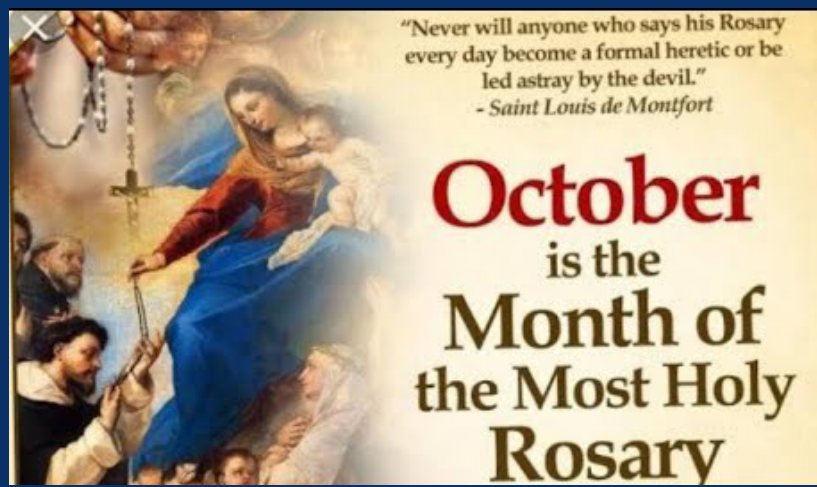

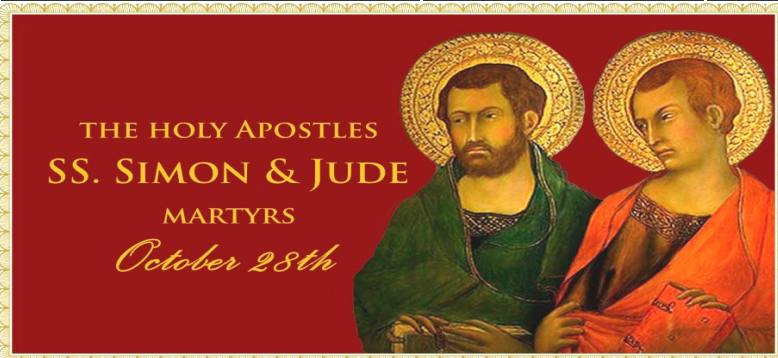

Dear All,

This week the Pharisees and Herodian take the offensive, which we also tend to do when we are caught in an uncomfortable situation, which they experienced in last week Gospel, when he told them through a parable that they were going to be excluded from the Kingdom, because they were putting anything before God. Jesus is telling us that God always comes first. The Jewish leaders consistently put their interpretation of the Law before the love of God.

So today they strike back. They believe that they have cornered Jesus with an either/or question which would place Him at odds with either the Romans or the Jews. Jesus knows their strategy and He was prepared for it. They asked if it was lawful to pay tax to Caesar? His response: "Whose image is on the coin?" "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." Again, he challenges them to live according to God's law, not their interpretation.

Jesus' answer is more comprehensive than it first appears. It is actually setting up the next few liturgically

weeks of his ministry which liturgically ends with the Feast of Christ the King.

The central point of Jesus' answer revolves around the word: IMAGE. In the Book of Genesis, we read that God created man in "our image and likeness". The same word: IMAGE. Jesus acknowledges to the Jewish leaders that they must respect and obey the civil authorities, but more importantly they and the civil law is subject to divine law. Just as the coin carried Caesar's image and belongs to Caesar, so, too, the Caesar himself carries God's image—therefore Caesar and religious leaders are to obey God's law. It is when this order is misunderstood and even reversed that chaos exists—unfortunately this seems to be the situation in our times. Jesus challenges us who are made in God's IMAGE to put our God before all things.

What is Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO)

Indiana's Tax Credit Scholarship program was created in 2009 as a way to give families who meet income guidelines an opportunity to send their child to a participating private school. Through the generosity of Hoosiers like you, private donations are given as scholarships so students may attend a private school that may not have been an option to them otherwise.

Why donate?

Donors receive a state tax credit of 50% of their donation amount!

In addition to supporting Indiana students and giving them access to a high-quality education they may not have received otherwise; Indiana donors receive a state tax credit equal to 50% of their donation amount. Donations also qualify as a charitable deduction on federal tax returns.

Frequently Asked Questions

Is there a limit to how much I can give and still receive the tax credit?

No, provided the donation does not exceed the available credits under the cap. (The state has allocated \$14 million for fiscal year 2019 and resets annually on July 1).

Who receives the scholarships, and can I designate a school or a student to receive my gift? Indiana K-12 students who meet income eligibility guidelines and attend a participating school. You may designate your gift to a specific school, but not to a specific student.

Are there conditions to giving from a Donor Advised Fund? Granting the credit is subject to two major conditions, both of which must be met. First, the credit can only be granted to the original donor of the funds. Any other individual may not claim the credit. Second, the donor must be willing to be subject to any federal provisions that come along with taking the credit. This includes: Potential exposure to reduced charitable deductions (determined as of when the contribution to the DAF is made) and Potential exposure to federal excise taxes, especially those under IRC section 4958.
