OUR MISSION STATEMENT



Dear All,

This week's Gospel about the ten virgins can be distilled into the self-reflection: am I prepared to enter into the wedding

feast—am I prepared to participate fully in Mass? One way to be properly prepared is to read the Sunday readings from your Magnificat prior to coming to Mass. The other important aspect to being prepared and in the right disposition to participate fully in Mass is to NOT be in the state of serious sin. Serious sin prohibits you from receiving Holy Communion, and fully completing the Eucharistic sacrifice.

To participate fully in the Mass, the Sacrifice of Christ on the cross, we need to be 'sinless'. At Mass we see the veiled Face of God in the consecrated bread and wine. To look on the face of God we need to be 'without sin.'

The church's liturgy prepares us to be sinless—to be the perfect vessel to receive the sacramental presence of God into our body—through the penitential rite at the beginning of Mass. Through this rite we acknowledge that we are sinners, as we cry out to God: have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. "Lord have mercy." Through this rite, our venial or lesser sins are forgiven so that we are prepared to listen to the Word of God, and to receive His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, under the form of bread and/or wine. At Mass we are participating in a veiled way the heavenly homeland.

The penitential rite, however, does not absolve you of more serious or grave (mortal) sins, since you do not have the life of Christ within you—you are without sanctifying grace. This penitential rite offers you 'actual grace.' This actual grace is an action of God which encourages you to choose the good.

The ordinary way of being absolved from such serious sin is to confess this sin to priest during the Sacrament of Penance. This parish offers time for confessions primarily on Tuesday and Friday evenings from 5:30pm to 6:30pm during the Adoration hour at Holy

Family. Of course, if you are aware of serious sin, you can always call the office to arrange for a private confession anytime.

The sacrament of penance has been called by many names—three most common are Confession, Penance or Reconciliation. I love these references because the first letter of each word identifies the true nature of the Sacrament: CPR. Through our participation in this sacrament we are brought back to spiritual life from spiritual death—the result of committing a mortal sin.

In this neo-pagan culture, there are many sinful behaviors which are considered common and socially acceptable, but they are in contradiction to God's law. The most obvious is the role of sex in our society. It is serious sin to engage in any sexual activity outside of the bonds of sacramental marriage. Another is the place of God in our lives. It is a serious sin to miss Mass *intentionally* on Sundays and obligated Holy Days. Participation in either of these activities prohibits you from receiving the Holy Eucharist when you do attend Mass. St Paul says that we "eat and drink unworthily to our own condemnation."

Even if you are in the state of mortal sin, you are still required to participate in Mass, as much as you can. It is a source of 'actual grace' in your life. This grace encourages you to listen faithfully to the Word of God, and to make a spiritual communion—while others are receiving the Sacrament. In your spiritual communion, you are acknowledging that you cannot **NOW** receive our Lord in Holy Communion, but you are longing for to the time that you can approach the table of the Lord.

Next week, I will offer a reflection on how to make a good confession. As we enter the Advent Season, we will have additional opportunities for confessional times both here and at our neighboring churches.
