

Dear All,

Last weekend's Gospel was the story of the talents. The summary of the Gospel is that God gives each of us gifts to develop for our good and the good of the world we live in. For the last few weeks we have been marching toward the feast of Christ the King. Jesus has given us the path to walk: to follow the two great commandments. In previous *Notes*, I offered some suggestions on how to follow the first commandment. To-day with our talents we are being asked to follow the second great commandment. And it doesn't matter when we received 10, 5 or even 1. We are called to use the talents God has given us for the cause of the kingdom: to preach to the nations of our redemption by Jesus Christ.

God has made a covenant with the Israelites: that He would be their God, and they would be His people. We Catholics are the new Israel, and the covenant is now with us. The Hebrew word to make a covenant is to "seven yourself" to another. By His covenant God makes us part of His family. The Church often organizes itself in "sevens: there are seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, seven sacraments. This is one way in which the Church continues to remind us that, by His covenant, we are part of His family and our obliged to witness to His love in the world.

Today through the readings, the church has developed for us the seven Spiritual Works of mercy and the Seven Corporal Works of mercy. Through this way of talking about our duty to serve our neighbor, the Church is instructing us to invite them into our family through these very human service covenants, and to demonstrate His specific love for each person.

Today, the Church gives you the seven Spiritual Works of mercy and the Seven Corporal Works of mercy as the way you can follow this second greatest commandment. The Seven Spiritual Works of mercy give us the ways in which we are to love your neighbor as yourselves as He has loved us. The seven spiritual works are (1) To instruct the ignorant; (2) to counsel the doubtful; (3) to admonish the sinner; (4) to comfort the sorrowful; (5) to bear wrongs patiently; (6) to forgive offences patiently; (7) to pray for the living and the dead. The first four works are to assist your neighbor through your kindness, and the final three works are about how you are to accept difficulties in your lives—to dual spokes of this commandment to love as God loves.

Then the Church gives us the Seven Corporal Works of mercy. These corporal works are about your putting *charity into action*. They are recounted in this week's Gospel from the evangelist Matthew: (1) to feed the hungry; (2) to give drink to the thirsty; (3) to clothe the naked; (4) to visit the imprisoned; (5) to shelter the homeless; (6) to visit the sick; and to (7) bury the dead, as the litmus test for entry into the Kingdom of God. However, this charity is not just about doing something; it is about recognizing that the individuals you are helping are the presence of Christ in your life. Just as the Apostle Paul learned on his way to Damascus, when he fell down, he heard the words, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" The response was "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting me." Christian charity is about a personal encounter with Christ in this world, so that He will recognize us and be called to be with Him forever in the eternal rest.





I share this original poem, written a few weeks ago, with you, my brothers and sisters, as a testament of my love for Jesus and my desire to serve Him in private and in public.






