Dear All,

This weekend at the 10AM Mass, our parish will celebrate the Rite of Enrollment and Sending for Recognition by the Bishop of our catechumens and candidates who will enter into our church at the Easter Vigil Mass. These are the individuals who are participating in the annual Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA).

The RCIA program operates at every Catholic parish to prepare individuals both liturgically (to know how the Church prays) and educationally (to know what the Church believes) to become members of the Roman Catholic Church. This program was developed on the principle of "The law of prayer is the law of belief." Unlike other Christian traditions, "accepting Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior" is not enough; it is only the first step. As Catholics, we would call that statement an "actual grace" - a singular prompting by God to turn to Him.

As a parish program of initiation for individuals who want to be members of a Catholic parish, this program makes a demand of each of us to live our faith—and not just on Sunday morning. The program not only invites all of us to live so as we attract others to join our faith community, but also requires us to invite them and to pray for those individuals who are already participating in the RCIA program.

In addition to prayer and living a faithful life, there are many different ways you can participate in this program. Each catechumen needs a personal sponsor. Often, it is a family member, or a friend, but it is better to be a member of the parish who can serve as guide to assist the catechumens learn about the parish. From the time a person decides to explore the RCIA program, the parish should provide a member who will bring/meet the person weekly to/at Mass to introduce them to the uniqueness of our Mass, as the Unbloody Sacrifice of the Cross made present today, and to invite them to participate in other devotional activities of the parish.

Unfortunately, many RCIA programs operate in a vacuum within a parish. There is a team that offers classes of instruction, that may include the individual's sacramental sponsor. The program may also only celebrate the major liturgically rites during three weeks in Lent. However, there are various minor and major liturgical actions that

take place throughout this preparation period to involve all the members of the parish at Sunday Masses.

The first major liturgical rite is the Rite of Acceptance. (We held this rite a few weeks ago at the 10AM) Mass. During the Rite of Acceptance, we prayed over the individuals and anointed them with Holy Oil, as a protection against the forces of evil. The individuals were presented with a cross, the sign of our redemption.

The second major liturgical rite is the Rite of Enrollment and Sending for Recognition by the Bishop. During this Rite, we pray over the individuals. Each catechumen will enroll his/her name in the "Book of Enrollment" an expression of "The Book of Life" (Rev.20:12). This enrollment now entitles the catechumen to all the benefits of being a Catholic, including a Catholic funeral, and burial in a Catholic cemetery, if the person should die before Catholic Baptism.

The next major liturgical rites are the three Scrutinies (critical observations) in Lent, where the catechumens are presented with the words of the Creed and the Lord's prayer.

The RCIA program culminates in the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. Catechumens are baptized, the doorway sacrament into the life of grace. They then receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, which strengthens them in their belief, and makes them a full member of the Church. Finally, they are invited to participate fully in the Sacrifice of the Mass, by receiving the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ to nourish them on this journey.

The RCIA program doesn't end with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation. During the Easter Season, they are invited to participate in what is called the "Mystagogy", a post-Baptismal catechesis. This is another period of instruction to deepen their new Catholics spirituality, as they live out liturgically their faith.

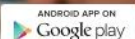
