



Nick Notes

Dear All,

In last week's homily, I indicated that the readings of the Mass in the Lenten Season recalls for us the history of salvation. The

purpose of these readings is to invite the new catechumens, as part of their final period of praying/learning, into the memory of our salvation history, as a way for them to know their new family's story. It is also an opportunity to remind us of our family story—the story of how God loves us and made us part of his family through covenant, and then a child of God through the sacrament of Baptism.

Last week's readings recalled the renewal of the covenant after the world had fallen away from the ways of God. He flooded the world, saving Noah and his family, and the animals, so that He could repopulate the world. Noah offered a sacrifice to God, and God put a rainbow in the sky as a sign of this renewal. St. Peter tells us this salvation through water prefigures the Sacrament of Baptism through which we become a child of God, a new member of God's family. The Gospel tells us that Jesus successfully rejected the temptation of Satan.

This week's reading gives us another insight into our family history. It is the story of the binding of Isaac through which God rescued Abraham's son of the promise by a ram caught in thorns. This reminds us that it is through faith that we are saved. The Apostle tells us that although faith saved Abraham's son, He offered His Son for the salvation of the world. The Gospel affirms for us that Jesus is the divine Son of God.

Next week we will hear the "Ten Words", these are the ten commandments which we follow to grow in holiness. The first tablet places God at the center of our lives, and the second tablet teaches us how to live with our neighbor. The Apostle, however, identifies faith in the crucified Christ as the new standard of holiness. Jesus in the Gospel overturns the money changers who placed greed in first place, in front of God. Our readings this week insist in our new family, our relationship with God the Father, through the Son, is central to our lives to our growing in holiness, happiness and eventually eternal life. The old Baltimore Catechism tells us the purpose of life is to "know, love and serve God in this life and to be happy with Him in the hereafter."

On the fourth Sunday of Lent, we learn that the Israelites have not lived the life of holiness for which they were called and God allow their temple to be destroyed and for them to be sent into Exile. After seventy years, God calls Cyprus, the king of Persia, to return the Israelites to their homeland and to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem. As Cyprus prefigures God's caring by returning that generation, the Apostle emphasizes the rich in mercy God offers His

mercy to every generation who transgress his ways. The Father sent The Son to be among us, to demonstrate how to live according to His ways. We heard that we are saved through faith in Jesus; it is a gift of God to us. The Gospel again recalls how God saved the wilderness people through faith by Moses lifting up the serpent, so too we are saved through faith in the crucified Christ, the divine Son.

On this fifth Sunday of Lent we learn that the time is coming when God will renew the covenant again. He will not act as in the past, when He trained and led the people of Israel out of slavery into freedom. This time He will place His law into our hearts, so we need to turn inward to experience for ourselves God's love, and then demonstrate that love by the way we live our lives. The Apostle tells us it is Jesus, through His passion, death and resurrection, became for us the source of eternal life for those of us who follow Him. The gospel again re-enforces that we are to follow Jesus, that it is through following Him, that we shall gain eternal life.

On Palm Sunday we hear the Prophet Isaiah tells us that God is our help, even when others are against us. The Apostle tells us that Jesus who is God, left the glory of heaven, to come among us to teach us the ways of the Father. The Gospel recounts for us the result of His choice to live among us: His passion and death.

The Lenten liturgy offers us the highlights of our family story so that our catechumens know about the family they are joining through the Easter Sacraments. It demonstrates again for us saying, "the law of prayer, is the law of belief." Our hearing of these readings is also a reminder for us of our family history.

You may not hear all these readings during this Lent, as the church recommends readings from the Gospel of Matthew during the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent. The Gospels readings of the woman at the well, the man born blind and the raising of Lazarus presents a liturgical catechesis on the sacrament of Baptism.

In summary, the story of the woman at the well teaches us that our *desire* for true happiness can only come from the spring of eternal water. The man born blind demonstrates only through the *action* of Baptismal washing our state of life is changed. The raising of Lazarus tells us of the *result* of this washing is eternal life. And this is only possible because of God's love through the Son's passion death and resurrection.




