THANK YOU: I wish to thank everyone in the Parish for all of the prayers and moral support that you gave me as I went through chemo and radiation treatments for bladder cancer this winter. Just as the Parish & Community came through for me with prayers and support 42 years ago when I was severely injured in an oil field accident, you did so once again. I believe that I received several miracles back then, the biggest being that I lived though it when I was not expected to. I put my trust in the Lord and promised Him that if He would allow me to live long enough to help my wife raise our son together, I would try to be a better person in my faith and turn my life around. Once again, I believe the Lord has granted me with a few miracles. I went for my first follow-up checkup during Holy week. The doctors found no tumors left in my bladder and the MRI showed that everything was clear from cancer. All the doctors could see was some inflammation and some dead tissue in the bladder. They were expecting that I may need to take some pills for 6 weeks to clear up any small tumors that could be left, but I don't need that at this time. They were amazed at how well I had come through my treatments with very little side effects. I expected to feel far worse than I did. I attribute that to your prayers and putting my complete trust in the Lord. I still have to go for checkups every 3 months, but again want to say...Thank you for your prayers! Pat & Sally Golberg
