CLOSING THE BUDGET GAP CHALLENGE: ENDS SOON

The COVID-19 pandemic has had an unprecedented effect on global health and the global economy. Our parish recognizes that families in our community are struggling and in need of support. Your unwavering



generosity helps our parish continue to support those in need, our many ministries, and the faith formation of our school and religious education students. The demand at our food pantry has more than quadrupled since the start of the pandemic.

Our fiscal year-to-date collections, through December 6, 2020, are in the red and considerably off of the budgeted amount by \$148,346. Each week, this gap widens. Weekly collections are down \$58,945 from actual collections a year ago. Like any household, we have maintained a tight focus on costs and operating expenses. You may look at the parish social media and e-newsletter to find out exactly where we stand as of today (the early Carpenter deadline prevents us from having current to-date amounts herein). We are off to a great start. Donations are coming in!

Protocols for the two Drive-in Masses in the Hurlburt Court Parking Lot

- Drive-in Mass participants must register the one vehicle, not the persons.
- Parking will be every other spot to accommodate 6-foot social distancing.
- Traffic control will direct you to appropriate space. First come, first served.
- All must remain in their cars.
- Donations can be placed in a large receptacle clearly marked in the lot.
- There will be a radio transmitter which you can tune into at 87.9 FM.
- The communion host will be passed through your car window.
- There will be no music. Mass is approximately 30 minutes.

Protocols for In-Church Masses

- Parking available in front of church and on Broadway Street. Parking for 10:45 In-church Mass: arrive 10-15 minutes early to allow time to park. Park on the north side of the church (Maple Avenue) or in the 200 N. Milwaukee Avenue lot or on Broadway. There is a Drive-In Mass at 10:45 a.m., so please do not use the back parking lot on Hurlburt Court and Park Place.
- Each individual attending must be registered separately.
- Arrive 5 minutes early for check-in.
- All four entrances will be open on weekends.
- The pews will be marked for spacing and seating.
- Certified, trained greeters will verify that you are registered and wearing a mask.
- Only Music Ministers may sing.

If you have registered and find you are unable to attend, please update your registration to allow your fellow parishioners the opportunity to worship in person, as we are nearing capacity.




THE TWELVE DAYS OF GIVING

Dear St. Joseph Parishioner,

The Invest in Kids Tax Credit Scholarship Program provides Illinois children access to scholarships that could cover up to 100% of their tuition, depending on financial need. I write to you today to ask that you prayerfully consider donating to Empower Illinois' Tax Credit Scholarship program and designating St. Joseph Catholic School, Libertyville as the recipient of your funds. When you contribute to this program, you will receive a state tax credit equal to 75 percent of your contribution. What an amazing opportunity—support St. Joseph students while significantly reducing your state tax bill.

Last year, the Archdiocese of Chicago ran a 2:1 matching promotion from December through February. That promotion resulted in \$100,000 in scholarships for 19 students at SJCS. This year, I am excited to announce that the Archdiocese is again offering the 2:1 matching opportunity. Every \$1 donated to Empower Illinois by February 28, 2021 (and naming our school as the recipient of your donation) will be matched 2:1. This is an enormous opportunity for our students in need. In order to take advantage of this 2:1 matching opportunity, your donation must be made to Empower Illinois between December 1, 2020 - February 28, 2021. During the first year of this program, only three SJCS students received a Tax Credit Scholarship. Now, in our third year of Tax Credit Scholarships, 19 students received a scholarship toward their SJCS tuition obligation. However, six students remain on the scholarship wait list. Even in our community of Libertyville, the need is still great for many families, especially now due to the pandemic.

As you know, St. Joseph Catholic School offers an outstanding education rooted in faith and service. 



You may also see the sender's actual email address by using your mouse to hover over the sender's name or by viewing the "reply to" address. Please always confirm by phone or in person before sending money or clicking on links.





BREAKING OPEN THE WORD



A JOURNEY TO DISCIPLESHIP-JESUS COMPANIONS US THROUGH SCRIPTURE

- 1. Proclaim God's Word. Choose someone to read the Scripture. After reading, there is silence from the group in reverence.
- 2. Invite Response. Invite individuals to respond to a word, phrase or passage that strikes them in some way.
- 3. Praise God. After a period of response, close by leading the group in praise of God by praying together the Glory Be.

NEXT SUNDAY'S GOSPEL — Matthew 2:1-12

Leader: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's ap-

pearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage."

After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way. The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

REFLECTION For many Christians, next Sunday's Feast of the Epiphany (the ancient definition being 'manifestation') brings to an end the Twelve Days of Christmas. During Advent and Christmas, we were encouraged to make room for Jesus in our hearts and in our lives. With the arrival of the Christmas season we were once again reminded of the powerful gift of grace that flows into our lives and our own little holy families as a result of Christ's entry into the world as a fully human and fully divine person. Next Sunday's Gospel reading is much more than a tidy little ending to the Christmas narrative, in that it contains a significant proclamation of the powerful new beginning that we celebrate with the birth of Christ. In the gifts of frankincense, myrrh and gold we find Jesus honored as priest, prophet and king. We see in the journey and the generosity of the Magi a reminder of what our response should be to God's generous gift of His Son. We also are called to respond by glorifying God and developing grateful, generous and enthusiastic hearts.

The New Urban Dictionary defines an epiphany as "the sudden realization of or comprehension of the larger essence or meaning of something." In this context, the Feast of the Epiphany invites us to look beyond the warm and wonderful accounts of the birth of Jesus and comprehend as well the difference that is available for each of us who has been baptized into the faith. As we move deeper into the new year, let us pray for the grace to resist the temptation of putting Christmas behind us and instead to embrace the spirit of "the Epiphany" which calls us to live each day aware of the opportunity to give glory to God. Let us generously share His loving goodness with our family, friends and all of those in need of love in their lives.

For further reflection on the Epiphany, see *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, paragraph 528; and on God's salvation plan, paragraphs 1-3 and 1066-1068.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS 1. What gifts might I present to the Christ Child that reflect my appreciation for the difference His presence has made in my life? How far am I willing to go to seek out a deeper encounter with Jesus? What holds me back from moving further along the path to greater holiness? 2. As Catholics we believe that at every Mass we offer our lives to give glory and honor to God for the gift of our salvation through the Paschal mystery of Christ's life, death and resurrection. Do I come to Mass to offer my life up to God? How do I view my participation in the Mass? Do I see it as an obligation or as an opportunity to give of myself in order to be united with the Risen Lord? 3. Gratitude is an appropriate response to the gifts so graciously and abundantly showered upon us by our living God. What can I do to better demonstrate to family and friends my gratefulness to God for sending Jesus into the world to redeem and save me?
