



Vernon – Liberty Grouping Renew My Church Update

May 2022

St. Joseph Parish, Libertyville and St. Mary of Vernon Parish, Indian Creek

Discernment Process

During the past few months, St. Joseph and St. Mary of Vernon Parishes engaged in the Renew My Church (RMC) review and discernment process. The Grouping Feedback and Discernment team (GFDT), which was made up of members from each community, met to review and discern how to respond to the call to renewal for the grouping's parishes, including any potential changes to parish structures.

Based on their meetings and feedback gathered from the larger parish community, they submitted feedback to the archdiocese. The Archdiocesan Standards and Recommendations Commission, which includes representatives from across the Archdiocese of Chicago, reviewed the feedback and other information, including financial summaries and parish trends.

Cardinal Cupich and Bishop Grob are grateful to the parish leaders who gathered as a Grouping Team, as well as all the parishioners who offered feedback through the discernment process.

Outcome

In the past few weeks, Cardinal Blase J. Cupich, archbishop of Chicago, the archdiocese's auxiliary bishops, and the archdiocese's Presbyteral Council met to discuss the Commission's recommendation. Based upon those discussions and prayerful consideration, Cardinal Cupich made the following decisions regarding the Vernon - Liberty grouping.

- **Both parishes will remain in their current structure.**
 - Cardinal Cupich affirmed the feedback that formally uniting the parishes would not be fruitful for the sake of renewal.
 - The RMC Commission was excited to learn about the work of renewal already begun in each parish and the commitment of each parish to continue on the path of renewal with an even deeper focus.
 - Cardinal Cupich affirms the grouping team's vision that continued work, especially in the area of evangelization and re-evangelization of parishioners, will be necessary to reground people in their discipleship. We know that only disciples can invite and inspire other disciples.
 - Pope Francis calls us to not only be disciples of Jesus, but Missionary Disciples who share the Good News of Jesus in the world around us, a world yearning to hear and know Jesus.
 - The Renew My Church imperative of making disciples will continue to be the mission into the decades to come.
- St. Joseph School will continue in its current structure.

Next Steps

The parish communities will continue to the next phase of renewal, focusing on strong evangelization to the world around us. Specifically, with the support of the Parish Vitality Coordinator, Eleanor Segraves, and the Evangelization team of the Archdiocese, your parishes will continue to build the new reality, focused on deepening discipleship, and supporting disciples in becoming missionary disciples for the work of evangelization. The renewal process calls us to become a stronger, more sustainable presence for the future, capable of reaching more people by sharing our discipleship in Jesus Christ, building communities with one another and inspiring witness in the world around us.

SYNOD

Thank you again for all those that participated in completing the online Synod Survey and attending the listening sessions. Approximately 250 people made their voices heard.

We have submitted to the Archdiocese of Chicago the synthesis for the 2021-2023 Synod on Synodality.

The synthesis is available on the St. Joseph Catholic Church website on the Synod tab. Please take a moment to read it.

This is a first step in a longer journey. The Synod Team now passes the torch to the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), the leadership team representing the various aspects of parish life, from finance to faith formation. The PPC will employ the Synod Synthesis in a larger planning process for setting parish goals. This process has already begun and continues in current Parish Pastoral Council and staff meetings. We also cannot ignore the many voices we did not hear in this synod. The demographics information about respondents reveals that a large segment of the parish did not participate. We believe there is something to hear in the silence. Thus, engaging the disengaged has emerged as a major priority for the parish.

Again, we extend to all of you our gratitude for your honesty, openness, and sincere desire to see the Church thrive.



Feast of Corpus Christi SUNDAY | June 19



Saint Juliana of Liege (1193-1258), who had a great reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, began the cause for the feast day of Corpus Christi. This day would be apart from Holy Thursday when the Church focuses on not only the Eucharist but the washing of the feet, ordained priesthood, and Jesus in agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. Saint Juliana was motivated by a recurring vision of the Church as a full moon with one dark spot, which she interpreted as the absence of a specific reverence to the Holy Eucharist. In her later years, she gained the support of Jacques Pantaléon, at the time Archdeacon of Liège, and other Church leaders. Pantaléon was later elected Pope Urban IV and went on to establish the Feast of Corpus Christi.

What conversation will be heard?

Join an evening presentation that will answer those questions and explore the role that Viator House of Hospitality plays in the lives of young people so far from home seeking protection in our nation. Since opening in 2017, Viator House has welcomed 95 young people from 22 nations who've fled to our country alone. Viator House offers them a safe home along with opportunities for education, work, therapy and connections with the religion of their choice. Abdu is only one of the many thousands of children who flee alone to the U.S. each year seeking protection. More than 130,000 came in 2021 alone. What happens when they arrive? Where do they go? What legal avenues protect them from being deported back to danger? How does Viator House make such a big difference? What can you do to support young people seeking safety in the U.S.? As Jesus said to his followers, "Come and see." People are invited to order their beverages and dinner before the presentation and meet other parishioners.

Care for Creation & the Laudato Si' Action Platform



Care for Creation

In May we celebrated the 7th anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical, Laudato Si', On Carrying for Our Common Home, in which Pope Francis challenges us to rethink our relationship with nature. What better time than this season of rebirth. We respond to his message to hear "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor." We are called to make a difference in tangible ways with responsible and sustainable consumption. Some ways we can do this include:

- Supporting local farmers' markets.
- Buying local. Our grocery stores are carrying more and more produce from Illinois farms much of the year. Check the labels. Tell the grocers that you care.
- Planning zero-waste picnics and BBQs. Use reusable plates, utensils, cups, cloth napkins. Get creative, for example, serve finger food, desserts in mason jars. Ditch the water bottles for reusable ones.
- Composting. Libertyville residents who rent a cart for landscape waste are permitted to place organic waste (fruits and vegetables) in the cart along with their landscape waste. Or you can compost in your own backyard.





SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

June 5 | Pentecost Sunday

Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13; John 20:19-23

THE SPIRIT'S ACTIVE POWER

The mystery of the Trinity refers to one God in three persons. We frequently acknowledge Jesus as “the second person of the Trinity,” but referring also to the Spirit as a “person” comes less naturally. In religious art, the Holy Spirit often appears as a dove or, as in today’s reading from the Acts of the Apostles, tongues of fire. Much rarer are images of the Spirit as a “person” in recognizable human form. Today’s readings do not settle the issue of how to picture the Spirit, but they certainly give shape to the Spirit’s active power in the world and in each human heart. In Acts, the Spirit enables people to speak and understand a variety of languages. Paul’s letter to the Corinthians praises the Spirit for all kinds of spiritual gifts, services, and “workings.” Finally, in John’s Gospel, Jesus calls the Spirit our Advocate and our divine teacher.

June 12 | The Most Holy Trinity

Proverbs 8:22-31; Psalm 8; Romans 5:1-5; John 16:12-15

BIBLICAL ROOTS OF THE TRINITY

Today’s readings show some biblical roots of what Christians would later call the Trinity. Proverbs showcases the role of Wisdom in the work of creation, portrayed as a reality outside of God but integrated into God’s work of forming the heavens and the earth. We join the psalmist in sharing Wisdom’s delight in God’s handiwork: “O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth” (Psalm 8:2). In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes of peace with God through Jesus, and the love of God received through the Holy Spirit, distinguishing God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit while also displaying their abiding unity. Finally, in the farewell discourse from John’s Gospel, Jesus—who had earlier spoken of himself as Son of the Father—promises his friends that they will receive the Spirit of truth that will teach and guide them after his departure.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

June 19 | The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Genesis 14:18-20; Psalm 110; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; Luke 9:11b-17

THE GIFT OF THE EUCHARIST

Today we hear how Abram encounters Melchizedek, “king of Salem . . . and a priest of God Most High” (Genesis 14:18). Melchizedek appears nowhere else in scripture, but is nonetheless significant. Psalm 110 declares of the great King David, “You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek,” a description later given (in the letter to the Hebrews) to Christ as High Priest.

Early Christians saw in Melchizedek’s bread and wine the bread and wine of the Eucharist; Paul’s account of the Last Supper (in today’s second reading) is the oldest one in scripture. In the Gospel, Luke describes Jesus providing bread for a crowd in words similar to Paul’s, words still used by the Church: Jesus takes bread, gives thanks, breaks it. Together, these three readings reveal how Christian priesthood, Christ’s Real Presence, and the call to serve those in need are all found in the gift of the Eucharist.

June 26 | Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21; Psalm 16; Galatians 5:1, 13-18; Luke 9:51-62

DISCIPLESHIP’S COSTS

In today’s first reading, God tells the prophet Elijah to prepare Elisha to succeed him. Succeeding Elijah will be no easy task; he has spent his life facing threats from the kings he has confronted about their infidelity to the God of Israel. The psalm illustrates the emotional and spiritual distress that the prophets’ steadfast faithfulness to God brought them. Paul’s description of the Christian’s freedom from the law as opposed to “the desire of the flesh” puts this struggle at the very heart of Christian identity. The reading from Luke’s Gospel recounts Jesus’ decision to journey toward Jerusalem, where he knows he will meet his earthly fate. Following Jesus—like succeeding Elijah as prophet—will now become more difficult. Unlike his calls to the first disciples, Jesus encounters those who are not ready or are not strong enough to journey with him.


