

# LETTER FROM FR. JAKE

#### Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

I would like to thank all of you who have participated in our 12th Annual Mass in the Park and all the dedicated parishioners who helped coordinate this wonderful and memorable event in the life of our parish. I would like to especially thank Gerry Salzman, the lead coordinator for Mass in the Park, and all who are a part of his team, for all their efforts in making that day grace-filled, exciting, and fun. Although we could not be in the park due to rain, we were able to celebrate Mass in our Church in thanksgiving to God's many blessings to our parish.

As I mentioned in my homily that day, what made this year's Mass in the Park special is that it falls within our Jubilee Year of Hope. Pope Leo reminded us that we are "Pilgrims of Hope," and he continues to invite us to be tangible signs of hope in the world.

When we look at the picture of the Jubilee Year of Hope, we will see three important images on it. First, we see a boat with people on it. The boat is the symbol of the Church, and as Pilgrims of Hope, we are all in the same boat together. Whatever your circumstances or background, we are called by the Lord to journey together. In our earthly pilgrimage, despite life's challenges, we walk by faith, not by sight. We walk with hope and do not despair, because we are pilgrims of hope and hope does not disappoint.

The second important image in the Jubilee Year of Hope is the cross bending toward the people in the boat. The cross is the symbol of our salvation in Christ Jesus. "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, for by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world." Each time we make the sign of the cross, we make an act of faith and thanksgiving, remembering that we have been redeemed by the precious cross of the Lord.

The third and final image of the Jubilee Year is the image of an anchor at the bottom of the cross. The late Pope Francis said that hope does not disappoint because hope has a name, Jesus Christ, and He is our anchor.

I would also like to highlight some important dates that we will celebrate and observe in the month of September. During this month, it is customary to celebrate Mass of the Holy Spirit to mark the opening of the academic year as well as our catechetical Children's Faith Formation (CFF) year.

On September 1, we observe Labor Day as well as the annual World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. While Labor Day honors the dignity of human work, the World Day of Prayer reminds us of our responsibility to care for God's creation. The late Pope Francis wrote, "Today as we celebrate World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, we reaffirm our vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which He has entrusted to our care, and to implore His help for the protection of creation as well as His pardon for sins committed against the world in which we live."

On September 8, we celebrate the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. "Let us rejoice in Mary's birth, the mother of Jesus. She was predestined to give birth by the 'strength of the Lord." This day reminds us of Mary's special role in salvation history and her faithful example. Then, on September 11, we pause to remember the tragic events of 9/11/2001. We honor the memory of all who lost their lives and pray for their families, as well as for firefighters, police officers, emergency medical technicians, and other first responders who continue to serve with courage and sacrifice. Finally, on September 14, we celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent, so must the Son of Man be lifted up. God highly exalted him and made him Lord. We adore thee, O Christ, and we bless thee, for by thy Holy Cross you have redeemed the world." This feast calls us to reflect on Christ's sacrifice and the salvation won for all.

I warmly invite everyone to come together with open hearts to remember, pray, and honor these meaningful days as a community, and "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." (Rom 15:13)

# DISCOVER THE CATHOLIC FAITH: OCIA INVITATION

#### Dear Friends,

Perhaps you have not completed your Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and/or Eucharist), or you want to convert to Catholicism, or you know someone who would like to learn more about their faith.

The OCIA (Order of the Christian Initiation for Adults) Program offers a unique opportunity to prepare for the Sacraments of Initiation and deepen understanding of the Catholic faith in a warm and inclusive environment. OCIA is structured to facilitate an encounter with the person of Jesus. The participants pray together, reflect on Sacred Scripture, study the teachings of the Catholic faith, and ask questions to more deeply ponder the revealed truths that surpass human understanding.

We will begin our program on **September 21, 2025**, and the OCIA candidates and catechumens will receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 5, 2026. After Easter, the newly initiated members of the parish continue to enjoy a period of spiritual growth and fellowship called "Mystagogy."
