Sacrament of Baptism – For Children to be Baptized, please call the Rectory to schedule a meeting.


Sacrament of Penance – Drive Thru Confessions on Tuesdays 5:45+ and Saturdays 3:45pm—4:45pm

Pastor's Corner

Blessings to Dads, Grads, and First Communicants! Happy Father's Day to all the **Dads**. Thank you for

sharing life with us. Congratulations to all the **St**. **Mary's School** kids who joined us for our end of the year celebration on Thursday evening in the SMS parking lot. Hopefully you were able to hear us on the radio. No question at all, there were some teary eyes as we had to say goodbye, but I know that we did the best we could to give these students (and students for the past 90 years) a good foundation for their next step in the journey of faith. And speaking of our young parishioners, the **First Communion** season is under way. At the time of printing, we're expecting that two will be receiving Holy Communion for the first time today!

"Talk about a site for sore eyes!" That was my impromptu first line from last Sunday's homily. It was so good to have 65 of you back at church for the 9:00 AM Mass. If you were with us in person or watching online, you know we had a cantor, a deacon, a short period of adoration, and most especially the Sacred Mysteries of our God and Lord coming to us. What a beautiful site.

There were just a couple practical points we need to do better as we continue to move forward:

- There needs to be one communion line. If you choose to come forward to receive Holy Communion, please form a single file line coming forward (this will keep you from walking side by side with someone else. When you get to the front, then you again split off to your respective side.
- When in the aisles, mind the hashmarks on the floor. They are at 6' intervals to help you space yourselves out on your way up to Holy Communion or on your way in/out of church.
- Singing: While we only need to be 6' apart for social distancing, singing requires a little more. When projecting your voice, the scientists tell us that particles can reach 12' distances. Therefore, a physical barrier (a plexiglass screen for our cantor or facemasks for the rest of us) is in order. And it is a good idea to plan to sing (as most of us do as a rule) in a reserved way.
- Reserving spots: It worked well for most of you. We'll continue asking you to make sure to save one of our 75 spots by signing up on Flocknote, on the parish website, or by calling the office.
