Sacrament of Baptism – For Children to be Baptized, please call the Rectory to schedule a meeting.


Sacrament of Penance – Confessions: Tuesdays 5:45pm—6:15pm, Saturdays 3:45pm—4:45pm, or by appointment.

#### Pastor's Corner

The **bulletin cover** this week shows an unusual picture: Jesus post-resurrection (note the wounds in his hands and side) giving the keys to Peter—as we'll hear in the Gospel today. This is a conflating of two passages. The gospel account happens in Matthew 16—well before the death and resurrection of Jesus. But we, from our vantage point two millennia later know that it is only in the light of the resurrection that Jesus' entrustment of authority to Peter and his successors makes sense. May we always be respectful of that authority and receptive of what the Risen Lord wishes to give to us!

I hope you got to watch the short video we made about the new **Religious Ed program** we're rolling out this Fall. Not only will it enable us to spread the faith from the safety of our children's own homes, but we're also excited that it will enable our kids and parents to grow in faith together.
