THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Today, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord! On the Feast of the Ascension, the church celebrates the return of Christ to the Father, his physical body leaving the earth behind.

The Ascension of the Lord took place 40 days after Easter, which this year, is celebrated on Ascension Thursday, May 26th. However, in most dioceses in



the Unites States, the celebration of this solemnity and holy day of obligation is transferred to the following Sunday, May 29th. The Ascension of the Lord is detailed in the Scriptures and in our creeds.

Every Sunday, we profess it in the Nicene Creed: "(Jesus) ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end." Jesus' ascension concluded his work on earth to bring about our redemption that he began on Good Friday. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 662) "Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father's glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his body, may live in the hope of one day being with him forever."

Wondrous God, you have given us much to celebrate. Jesus' rising from the tomb offered victory over death, giving us hope for eternal life.

Faith Formation Notes



One aspect of the Confirmation program is to ask our Conformandi students to write a saint reflection paper on their chosen Confirmation name. Below are some of the newly confirmed excerpted submissions.

...For Confirmation, I am choosing the saint name of Carmela, ... a name given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order. Our Lady of Mt. Carmel/St. Carmela dedicated herself to the protection and needs of the Carmelites. I can relate to this fact because as a big sister it's my job to protect my younger brother throughout life. I can follow Our Lady of Mt. Carmel's example and become a better Christian by speaking up more for the protection of others, more so out of my inner circle.

...Finally, I want to be confirmed because it is God's will. He has chosen for this to be my path. To me receiving the sacrament of Confirmation means gaining a closer bond with the Catholic Church and more specifically God and Jesus. Receiving Confirmation means I will become more of an adult in terms of my faith. Through Confirmation I will experience all that the Holy Spirit has to give. This sacrament is also an extension of the grace given by God when we were baptized...(G.D.)

...Peter was the saint name I chose because I thought he had an interesting and amazing background story. Something I learned about Saint Peter is that even though you are weak sometimes, you can still become strong and powerful. I can relate to St. Peter's life by the things we do in life and the struggles we go through.

...To me being confirmed in my life as an adult in the Church means doing things you should do to show that you are Catholic, such as going to Mass regularly, making Jesus proud by the things I do for others, doing nice things for other people, and practicing the ways to be Catholic to show that you are a mature member of the Church. I chose Joseph as my saint because he was a good man. He was caring and kind to those around him. I learned that even though he was not wealthy, he still gave to those less fortunate. His faith was strong and his commitment to Mary and Jesus was something to be admired. I aspire to imitate his actions and strong commitment toward others in life.

...Confirmation is a very important sacrament in showing my commitment to God and the Church, as well as myself. I intend to continue my faith journey...(E.G.) ... When we were first told to choose a saint, I was feeling pretty overwhelmed. There were hundreds of different names and stories but St. Anastasia's story just stuck out to me. I chose this saint because even throughout all her struggles in life she still stuck with God and helped those who needed it.

...St. Anastasia felt this overwhelming need to help people who truthfully needed it. I have always wanted to go into the medical field not just because it seemed cool, but because helping someone in a way that they cannot help themselves can be one of the greatest joys.

... I am excited to be confirmed because this is my next step in the Church and to be closer to God. (E.C.)

...St. Helena, is my choice because she is a sign of strong devotion to God and a quality that stood out to me was she became devoted later in life. I learned that from her that no matter where you are in life God will always have His arms open.

...I can imitate St. Helena in her persistence and devotion of spreading God's Word and become a better Christian.

After receiving Confirmation I plan to continue lectoring at Mass and helping in the Church...(E.F.)

ASK A FRANCISCAN... Can Drums be Liturgical Instruments?

I'm a drummer who has been told by many clerics and laypeople that drums cannot be used during liturgies because they are "savage" and 'demonic."
Those reasons sound racist and/or demonic.
Can I use my drumming abilities as part of a Catholic liturgy?

The Catholic Church allows drums at liturgies. Some Masses celebrated at Vatican II (1962-65) used drums, and many places now employ them. I'm sorry for the misinformation that you have received about this. Unfortunately, some people easily assume that their personal preferences or dislikes automatically reflect what the Catholic Church allows or does not allow.
