#### Dear Friends,

The first Sunday of Advent is now upon us again. With it, we usher in a new year in the Church. The season has a two-fold character, it is preparation for celebrating Christ's birth and a reminder of his second coming in glory at the end of time. When Jesus was born, his arrival went unnoticed except for the faithful few who were prayerfully waiting for the coming of the Messiah. They had read the signs of the times correctly. Our readings contain some important pointers that warn us to be ready and prepared for the second coming of the Lord. No matter what else happens to us in our world, one fact remains unchanged and relevant – all roads in life lead to the Day of the Lord. During this time that leads to the celebration of Christmas we can benefit greatly from giving some real thought to who we are, what we are doing with our lives and how are we approaching the one great test that matters – our personal meeting with the Lord on judgment day. We are the masters of our destiny and that destiny depends a great deal on how we live at this point in our journey.

As a pilgrim people, what we celebrate in the Eucharist is Christ's presence among us now until He comes in glory. Each time we prepare to receive the gift of the Eucharist, we also have the opportunity to evaluate the way that we welcome Jesus into our hearts. Advent gives us the chance to improve our lives and increase the depth of sincerity we have for the practice of our faith including prayer and works of mercy.

Advent provides an opportunity to look at our lives and discern what needs to put right, to acknowledge our short-comings and to evaluate the ways we can do it better. If prayer has not been given a priority, now is a chance to begin all over again. Whatever our past has been, God is only too willing to look lovingly on us in the hope that we will be transformed by God's mercy. God's arms are always outstretched to welcome us. Advent is also a time to strengthen our friendship with God by thinking about God's tremendous love demonstrated in the gift of Jesus as our Savior. Advent is the time to allow Jesus to become our driving force. Peace and prayers,

Confessions: After the 5:00 PM Mass on Saturday or by appointment.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
