### Dear Friends,

When Jesus began his public ministry the initial reaction to his preaching was very favorable. He spoke in ways that the people understood. He spoke with authority but it was a different kind of authority than they were accustomed to hearing. He spoke with the kind of authority that was not trying to oppress people. He spoke of Good News, freedom, healing, hope, new life, and a way of life that promised happiness. However, as time passed some of those who found the words of Jesus to be uplifting at first began to find the same words uncomfortable and even disturbing. The discomfort was caused by the realization that the words of Jesus were calling the people to change their ways and even to change their thinking. For many people that call to change became disturbing because they were set in their ways and the thought of change proved to be too much. Change can often cause some discomfort as we are forced to examine various areas of our lives. To acknowledge that something has to change can be a daunting challenge.

As we hear the Gospel passage presented today along with the words of Jesus; "no prophet is accepted in his own native place," we are being asked to decide how much of Jesus' message we are willing to come into our hearts and minds. Are we willing to hear His message and allow all of it to touch us, or do we block some of it out because it is too challenging, too uncomfortable and will mean that we must allow change to become a reality?

No matter how many times people rejected the message of Jesus, he did not back down. He continued to speak with authority. Deep down, many of those who found his message challenging knew that He was right, and so do we. Fortunately, some of those who heard His message found the courage and strength to allow His words to bring about change. This dealt with the struggle and challenge and they found out that what Jesus said was true.

The challenge remains for us today to hear the words of Jesus and allow them to be the catalyst for change so that we can find out that His message was not simply a bunch of words that sounded nice, but were words that can lead us to experience new life.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
