Dear Friends,

A Gospel story where Jesus boldly says that he came to bring division even within family circles, should cause us to sit up and take notice and may even put us a bit on edge. After all, there is little as painful or agonizing as a family feud. We may even find these words of Jesus confusing since we have grown accustomed to turning to Jesus for comfort and peace in the midst of turmoil and strife. In actuality, the words we hear in the Gospel today were meant to help his followers face the realities that they were going to face in choosing to be followers of Jesus. Jesus wanted them to be warned so that they would fully understand the decisions they would have to make.

At the point when Jesus gave this message, he was on his way to Jerusalem, and his agonizing crucifixion. Opposition to his message and way of life was mounting. Many of the vocal Jewish authorities had decided that Jesus had rocked the boat to the point where their comfortable way of life and their authority were being threatened. Those who felt that they were more concerned about prestige and authority wanted Jesus silenced and they could think of no other way than to get rid of him. Jesus understood this. Jesus also understood that those who accepted his message and chose to be followers would be in for a rough ride. Some would be ostracized and condemned by the officials who wanted to make sure that when Jesus died, his message would die with him. Some of those who would continue to proclaim the message of Jesus would have to be willing to risk everything – family, community and even their lives. They would have to make a very difficult decision.

Even today, the teaching of Jesus demands acceptance or rejection. There is no escape in trying to play the part of an anonymous Christian. If we accept Jesus' teaching, we must also be ready to accept the ridicule that comes from those who reject it. Somewhere along the line we must make the decision to be followers of Jesus or not. If we choose Christ we must be ready to live a life that is in accord with his message — even if others think it is crazy. We cannot bend the message of Jesus to fit political or social ideologies - we simply have to accept it fully. There may be some conflict, but real peace will be ours.

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form the following is required: –Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
