Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

Just about everyone has, at times during life, experienced moments of doubt, confusion and anxiety. In the Gospel for this final Sunday of Advent, we find Joseph in a state of embarrassment and confusion because Mary, his betrothed, is with child. Being a man of honor, Joseph felt the right thing to do was to break his ties with her and divorce her informally and as quietly as possible. At the last moment, an angel appears to Joseph in a dream explaining that the child was the work of the Holy Spirit. Joseph was told not to be afraid to take Mary home as his wife and to accept the child as his own. There was a divine plan which Mary and Joseph were meant to share and help put in motion. With great patience and trust Joseph accepted the work for which God had chosen him. Joseph played a major role in the events of the first Christmas in Bethlehem. Joseph was a true and loyal servant who, with a husband's love, cherished his wife and accepted the responsibility of watching over the child Jesus.

The most striking thing about Joseph is the manner in which he opened himself whole-heartedly to God in quiet faith. Not one spoken word of Joseph is recorded in the Gospels but the facts of his life point to a person utterly obedient to the word of God. He demonstrated great humility in agreeing to take on the responsibilities of husband and father. He was at peace even though there would be a number of things that would unfold that he did know about and perhaps, did not even fully understand. His obedience to God was not without its difficulties or uncertainties but Joseph simply demonstrated trust that God's way would work out.

As far as we know, Joseph gave everything in the service of God. His example gives us courage to face problems in similar spirit and to keep believing, even when situations seem difficult or even hopeless.

During this final week of advent preparation, perhaps we can ponder and think about the example of Joseph because we too are asked to receive the gift of the Messiah into our hearts as freely and as fully as Joseph did. In doing so, we are assured of a very blessed Christmas.

FAITH TO MOVE MOUNTAINS

The Diocese of Trenton has been conducting an endowment campaign to secure the future of the Diocese. The campaign is designed to set up endowments for various aspects of ministry within the Diocese. These components include: Catechesis and Evangelization (\$5 million) - this includes training of Catechists, Adult Faith Formation and outreach to proclaim the Good News. Ordained Ministry (\$20 million) - this includes the education of Seminarians, care of retired priests and education for the Permanent Diaconate Program. Social Services (\$5 million) - which includes care and assistance to individuals and families in need, Diocesan Parish Counseling and Community Services. *Diocesan* Parish Assistance Fund (\$7.5 million) to help the poorest of the parishes in the Diocese to continue ministry in the poor areas. Catholic Schools (\$15 million) to help those Catholic Schools that are in financial trouble, provide tuition assistance to families in need, offer scholarships to those in need and provide for the financial needs of Mission Schools. Parishes (\$22.5 million) Parishes receive 30% of the funds collected for use in the parish. Our parish goal for the campaign is \$650,000 which means that our parish could receive \$195,000 if we reach the goal (or more if we surpass the goal), which we can use to pay down debt and continue to take care of parish needs. The funds will come in handy as we have faced a number of expenses recently – sound system replacement, parking lot repairs and lighting upgrades. As we go forward, we have to think about replacing the HVAC, resurfacing the parking lot, and all those little and big things that constantly wear out in a building this size.

Would you consider making a pledge to the campaign – your help is needed. Pledges can be made for up to 5 years. Any amount helps us to reach our goal of \$650,000. Pledges can be made over the course of up to 5 years. For example, A \$2,000 pledge paid over 5 years would be \$33.33 a month. Pledge cards are available at Church anytime. Thank you to those who have already made a pledge and thank you for any help you can give to this important endeavor. The care of the Church is a big job, but working together it can be easier.

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
