

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

A HAPPY AND BLESSED EASTER to all of you!

As we celebrate this most joyous day, our attention is focused on the Resurrection of Jesus. The Resurrection is God's great "YES" to the life that Jesus lived. Jesus came to lift people up, if they wanted to be lifted up. Jesus came to offer God's children the way to eternal happiness, if they wanted to find it. Jesus came to reveal the presence of God in the lives of every human being, if they want to notice that presence. Jesus came to offer freedom from those things, actions and events that seek to enslave human beings, if they wanted freedom. Jesus came to offer new life, but only if we want it. Jesus came to offer us so much, but only if we want it. As we celebrate Easter, one of the greatest questions that we should answer is, "Do I want what Jesus is offering?" God will never force any of us to accept what God is offering. We have to want it. One of the greatest challenges comes in believing that what we want is what God is going to give us. God already knows what we need and offers us everything that we need. Sometimes we must be willing to put aside what we want in order to see and accept what God is offering to us. This relies on our trust that God is giving us what we need, what is best for us and what will allow us to be lifted up. There is no need to beg for it. There is no need to make bargains. There is no need to believe that we must earn it. Everything we need is already offered to us by God. It is there for the taking, if we want it.

God is the fullness of mercy. God's mercy seeks to provide what we need to journey on the path that will lead us to God and eternal life. Easter reminds us that God wants to lift us up. We are called to be an Easter people. To be an Easter people we must try to recognize the outpouring of God's mercy in our lives.

As we celebrate this great Feast of the Resurrection, may your heart be filled with joy by accepting God's mercy. May you be lifted up by accepting God's gifts. May you rejoice because you have discovered that God is walking with you. And may you come to experience the joy of new life – because you have decided that you want it!

FR. MIKE'S 25TH ANNIVERSARY EVENT



Confessions: After the 5:00 PM Mass on Saturday or by appointment.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
