

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

Lent has begun. There is something about Lent that touches Christians deep down in our hearts. Lent presents us with the challenge to reject sin and to be faithful to God. Fasting, prayer and alms giving have traditionally been the central elements of Lent for Christians. They are tools, which we have been taught to use in order to edge closer to God as we continue our journey through life. No matter what we do during Lent, the most important factor is our motive. If someone fasts and deprives himself or herself of food simply to have a slimmer figure, there will be little spiritual benefit to be found. If a person lends a hand to others simply to establish a reputation as a dogooder in the community, that person cannot expect to grow closer to God. If someone prays simply looking for what he or she wants, that person will deprive himself or herself of what God knows we need.

It is spiritually beneficial to use the example of Jesus for our Lenten journey. Jesus went into the desert in order to evaluate his life, scrutinize his motives and to stand before God as nothing more, and nothing less, than what God the Father called Him to be. Metaphorically, Lent beckons us into the desert to do the same as Jesus. Lent invites us into the wilderness of our inmost being to see ourselves as we really are and to see ourselves as God sees us. No deception, no excuses, no denials, just an honest evaluation of how we have used all that God has given us to serve God and others. Sometimes exposing our inmost thoughts, desires, failures and procrastinations can be painful, but pain is not the desired outcome, growth and change are the only reasons to make the journey into the spiritual desert. Prayer, fasting, lending a hand, expanding our understanding of God's plan for us, learning more about our faith and sharing our resources are the tools that we can use to begin the adjustments that are needed in our lives.

All that we do to experience change must be focused on loving God more. There is no better motive than that. God knows who we are and loves us no matter what our shortcomings may be. God also knows who we can be and calls us to growth - not so that God can love us more, but so that we can find out how great it is to say yes to God's transforming love.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
