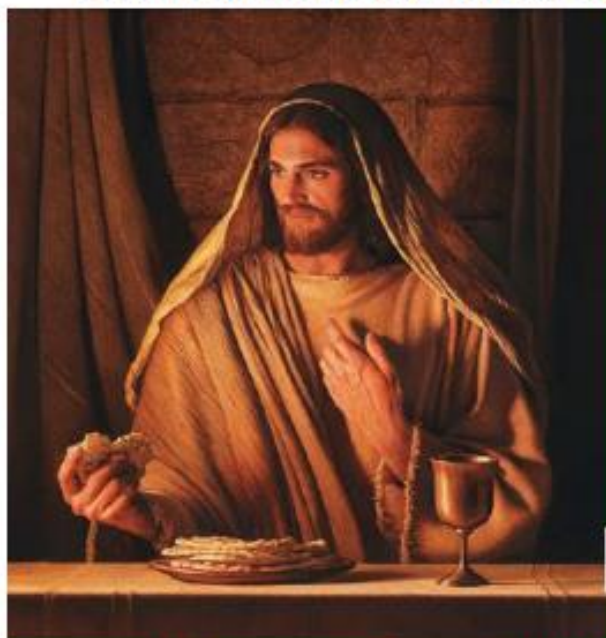

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

On the day following the miracle of the multiplication of the bread and fish, Jesus had an eager audience. They saw great things being done by Jesus and they were back for more. They were not necessarily looking for more bread or more fish; they wanted Jesus to satisfy another hunger that they had. Many of the people were hungry for a powerful, worldly king who would turn the tables on those who were currently in control. Some of the people believed that they were hungering for that power. Some of the people believed that their hunger would be satisfied by money and possessions. They really believed that having more money would take care of all of their hungers. They all hungered for the person that would be able to give them what they wanted. However, Jesus informed them that he was not serving a meal that would satisfy those kinds of hunger. Jesus knew that an appetite for worldly things, power, honor, prestige and status were insatiable. Nevertheless, Jesus wanted to give them what they needed to satisfy the real hungers that people experience. He wanted them to focus on the hungers that are important to life and that can be satisfied. Jesus was not going to be the one to offer the people worldly power, honor or prestige. He would offer them the way to satisfy their real hunger forever.

As we listen to the words of Jesus in the Gospel passage, the human heart needs nourishment. Deep down within each of us there is a hunger to love and be loved, to be listened to and be appreciated and above all to know that there is meaning and eternal value to our lives. These are the hungers of the human heart and the yearnings of the spirit of which Jesus wants us to be conscious and which Jesus alone can satisfy. At this depth is our hunger for God.

Tempted as we are by material needs, we are in constant danger of losing our taste for the food that will strengthen our souls and satisfy our hunger. Jesus asks each one of us, "do you hunger and thirst for what I have to offer you?" Where do our interests and true desires lie? Jesus wants us to realize our spiritual greatness. Jesus teaches us that our hunger for joy and happiness can be satisfied if we open our hearts to all that He has offered to us.

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
