Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

On this coming Thursday, we as a nation will celebrate a Day of Thanksgiving. Some will travel, some will gather with family around a table loaded with food or they may go out for a meal, some will work and yes, some will shop for those tempting megadeals that retailers hope will lure people into their stores. There will be football and there will be parades. There will be words of thanks offered before diving into the meals that smell so good. It is fitting, right and proper to offer our thanks, to verbalize our appreciation and to be mindful of our blessings. However, our celebration of Thanksgiving Day, as secularized as it may be, is about so much more than a few spoken words of thanks, football games, the legitimized practice of gluttony or a feast fit for a king.

In his Thanksgiving Proclamation in 1863, Abraham Lincoln called for a day that would begin much needed healing. There was great strife after the Civil War. There was bitterness. There was division. Lincoln knew that there could not be a true appreciation for what our Country offers in the midst of such turmoil. He asked that divine help that would lead to a time when the people and the nation, might enjoy fully, "peace, harmony, tranquility and Union." Lincoln hoped that a thankful people would become a united people. That is what true thankfulness brings about — unity.

As we approach Thanksgiving Day, we need to allow our thankfulness to remind us that God has blessed us and has called us to be united. Our acknowledgement of God's never ending goodness calls us to work to heal wounds that prevent us from experiencing more of the peace, harmony, tranquility and unity that God desires for us.

Therefore, in whatever way you are able, I invite you to join me in giving thanks for the blessings that we enjoy, so that we might join together and work for the common good of all – both in this nation and beyond our borders. We are, after all, one humanity, inhabiting this world that provides a home for us to enjoy.

May you feel the never-ending blessing of our loving God this Thanksgiving Day.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
