

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

There is no mistaking the theme that is proclaimed loud and clear in today's Liturgy – it is a message of hope and rejoicing. The call to rejoice, lift up our hearts and be happy presents a challenge for us and may require some soul-searching in light of the problems that may confront us at any given moment. With all the sadness that we witness we may be inclined to ask – what do I have to rejoice about, with illness, death, selfishness, rudeness, disappointments and uncertain future? If things were better, it may be easier to feel joyful.

Indeed, some of the dreadful things that take place in our world give little cause for rejoicing. However, from a Christian perspective, we must come to realize that Christian joy does not come from the absence of sorrow, hurt, pain or trouble but from an awareness of the presence of Christ within our souls. Paul was in prison when he wrote to the Philippians urging then to be happy and to rejoice in the Lord. Zephaniah managed to rejoice at the height of the Jewish exile when things could not have been worse politically and the nation was at a moral low point. In spite of disastrous circumstances, both men refused to allow the situations they faced to rob them of joy. Both had joy because they were grounded in the peace of God.

So on this Third Sunday of Advent we should ask how are we to attain such spiritual joy that should be rightfully ours? We simply have to turn to God and ask the same question of God that was presented to John the Baptizer. What should we do? John replied to the people in uncompromising language that the secret is to commit ourselves to God's way and in so doing find our peace. Happiness comes from doing good, being honorable and showing true concern for others, especially those in need. Doing these things does place demands on us and is not always easy. Giving of ourselves, in the way that God calls us to give, may contradict how society tells us to find happiness. Yet so many people of faith, like John and Zephaniah, give witness to true happiness. No one who has experienced the kind of joy that Christ modeled, in spite of his own suffering, would ever exchange it for all the pleasures and comforts of this world.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
