Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

As we enter the third week of our Lenten journeys, we are presented with the encounter of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well. Exhausted from a long walk in the hot sun. Jesus sat down and dismissed Jewish tradition by asking the woman for a drink. Jewish people in the time of Jesus did not speak to Samaritans. Thirst does not adhere to boundaries so the two got into a conversation, and the woman, taking Jesus literally, was amazed to hear that could provide her with water that would last forever. It would have been a blessing for the woman to not have to come back to the well so that she could be spared from the embarrassment of being snubbed by her neighbors who despised her because of her less than stellar lifestyle. As the conversation deepened, the woman came to realize that her own thirst was not from lack of water, but from an inner thirst that no earthly water could satisfy – a thirst caused by the absence of God in her life. The woman was looking for something that five different husbands did not provide. Jesus lead her to examine her deeply troubled life and helped to unburden her soul. With no condemnation, Jesus accepted her, and coming to terms with the bad choices she had made and the path she chose to follow, she was released from her guilt. Jesus gave her hope and offered her the living waters of friendship and the Spirit of God.

What it took five husbands to teach the Samaritan woman, we learn from examining our own lives and acknowledging the ways in which our thirst is not be satisfied because of bad choices, habits and actions. Examining our lives is not for the purpose of heaping on guilt, but to allow us to experience the same kind of conversion that the Samaritan woman enjoyed. Her conversion is meant to give us great hope because, in human perceptions, her conversion did not seem possible. The Gospel story today shows that because Jesus did not limit her due to her past, she was able to draw closer to Christ. Jesus won her over by gently leading her out of herself and raising her mind and heart to higher things.

Today, Jesus asks us to take a look at how we are living out our Baptismal call. If we are suffering from thirst, the Holy Spirit is always at hand to refresh us and lead us in our search for that which is eternal.

For those with children in the Religious Education Program, you must choose the class and session that you have a child attending. If you have a child in grade 3 and a child in grade 7 on Tuesday at 6:30PM, you would choose Tuesday 6:30PM grade 3 and Tuesday 6:30PM grade 7. If you are not signed up on Flocknotes, you will not receive notification about closings. Please remember to use contact information (cell number and email) that you use regularly. All information is confidential. Others are not able to view your information. Please remember that email and text message will be sent from Flocknotes. Thanks!

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
