

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

Bidding farewell to a loved one is not easy, and is something that most people never fully grow accustomed to doing. The Ascension marks the end of Jesus's earthly mission and His glorious return to the Father. He had achieved the work he was sent to do. While the trumpets may have been sounding in heaven to greet the arrival of the ascending Lord, the Apostles must have been experiencing a deep sadness in their hearts at his departure. However, his final words, "I am with you always. Go make disciples of all nations," while full of comfort were also urgent in meaning. Not only was Jesus not abandoning his followers or depriving them of his presence but He was entrusting them with the mission of making the love of God known to others. They were to fulfill this mission through joyful and selfless lives in the service of others. In Jesus' absence the disciples were not to remain inactive but were called to move in to the future with courage and determination. They had a vital and essential role to play in announcing the salvation Christ had won on Calvary, by transforming death into the dawn of a new life. Jesus may not have been present any longer in human body but His place would be taken by the Holy Spirit who would be their guide and strength as they journeyed through life.

If we ponder in our hearts the meaning of this great Feast, we may come to grasp something of the confidence which God has in us because the Ascension focuses on what we must do to be with Christ forever. Where Jesus has gone, we hope to follow. Like the Apostles, we are at the center of the stage and our call is also to service. We are to continue the work of those who have gone before us and help build up Christ's Kingdom in the here and now. In a world with no shortage of suffering and desperate people, we have the potential to turn sorrow into happiness being Jesus' comforting word and His smile of reassurance. The example we demonstrate with our lives may in fact be the only Book of the Gospel open for some people to read. How we respond to the trials and tribulations of everyday life speaks louder than anything else. How we welcome and interact with others show our acceptance or rejection of Christ's invitation to carry on His saving work. May the Spirit renew us so that we may know what is true and have the strength to do what is right.

Activities

All activities scheduled have been cancelled, some will be rescheduled when we are permitted to do so. At the current time there is no point in trying to set dates until we know exactly when activities and gatherings will be permitted to resume.

PARKING LOT MASS

As I stated in an email sent out thru Flocknotes, the Bishop has decided to allow parking lot Mass. This is not straightforward and has a great many limitations. I believe that we may be able to offer this on Sunday, May 31 for the Feast of Pentecost. I still have a few details to work out. If everything works, I will make an announcement thru Flocknotes and Facebook with the details. However, this would actually be a live streamed Mass. Mass will be celebrated in the Church. Those in the parking lot would have to watch via smartphones or tablets equipped with cellular service. The broadcasting over the radio is very challenging and all of the equipment is not available. Livestreaming from the parking lot is not very easy either because there is a significant lag time between what you would be watching me say and do and the audio you would hear. (kind of like a very old time movie where the lip movement and words are no in sync). So I made the decision to go with celebrating Mass inside, having everyone in the parking lot watch it and then come out to offer Communion. Please realize that there will be limitations to the number of cars – we can only use every other parking spot. Restrooms and access to the church will not be permitted. Of course, this will be weather permitting (right now the extended forecast does have a chance of thunderstorms so I will be watching this). You may not be in the parking lot with your car engine running for air conditioning – it is a violation of the idling law. Communion would be offered at the end as you exit the parking lot. So, this is limited. I will post all of the details – time, etc. – thru Flocknotes and Facebook and the website. So this is not good for everyone – I know it. I am limited by the rules that the Bishop has set up and the civil laws. I may only offer this one time a day. The Mass will still be available online. You will be able to watch the livestream from anywhere. You must be in the parking lot to receive Communion. Once the parking lot is full or Mass has started, no more cars will be permitted to enter. If this is going to work, everyone must cooperate and follow the rules and procedures – and that does mean everyone. If not, it cannot be offered again. So, watch through Flocknotes, Facebook or the website. And please pray for it all to go smoothly.

FOOD COLLECTION



Our normal food collections will not take place. You can still drop off donations in the box on the lower level or in the bin that is outside the front door to help those who may need something. The need for assistance continues to grow. Food banks are receiving more requests for assistance as people face financial challenges. Your donations are appreciated. We continue to get your donations to those in need.

COVID-19 RELATED NEWS

The Church is open for private prayer. This is for private prayer only. Communal celebration of the Sacraments, group meetings and prayer are all still on hold. Groups may not arrange for meetings. Here are some things to note –

- Only the side door (lower level) of the church will be open.
- If you come to the church for prayer, please leave the kneeler down in the pew that you use so we know which pews to clean.
- Please do not sit in a pew where the kneeler is down.
- If someone else is in the Church, keep the required 6 feet of social distancing.
- Restrooms will be closed for the time being.
- Masks are to be worn while in church. Gloves are advisable.
- Please do not walk around touching statues
- Holy water fonts will be empty until further notice
- Do not come to church if you are in any way ill. Let Fr. Mike know if you are in need of prayers or assistance of some kind. (Frmikestjoseph@optonline.net)
- Respect others who may be in the church by not talking while others are praying.

I will try to have the Church open from 10:00AM until 7:00PM but please recognize that there may be times that the church may be closed for cleaning, etc.

Getting back to communal celebrations will take time, patience and cooperation. Prudence and wisdom dictates being cautious so that no one is put at risk.

JESUS: THE WAY, THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE is a 10-week video study program and book presented by Marcellino D’Ambrosio, Jeff Cavins, and Dr. Edward Sri. Anchored in the life of Christ as presented in the Gospels, this study explores the entirety of Jesus’ life—who he is, what he is really like, what he taught, what he did for our salvation, and what all of this means for us as Catholics today. We are going to do this study online. Because of the current situation, each person will have to order his/her own workbook. 
VERY IMPORTANT - - HELP US TO BE IN TOUCH WITH YOU

The Parish has begun to use Flocknotes which is a program to send out email and text messages to parishioners. This will allow us to stay in touch about parish events, emergency closings and important information. To benefit from this, you must sign up with your cell phone number and/or email address. In the present time, it is important that we have a way to get news out to everyone. We will use Flocknotes to let parents know if Religious Education classes are canceled and we send out reminders about scheduled closings for holidays, etc. It is easy to be on the notification list – just text the code sjmill to 84576 and follow the prompts. You may also go to our website to be included – stjosephmillstone.org/flocknotes. Just enter your information and follow the prompts. You can then select the groups that you want information from. You can choose to receive the weekly bulletin or be notified if someone in the parish needs help or be notified when someone has asked for prayers or be part of special programs like the Lenten Program listed in the bulletin on the previous page and more. For those with children in the Religious Education Program, you must choose the class and session that you have a child attending. If you have a child in grade 3 and a child in grade 7 on Tuesday at 6:30PM, you would choose Tuesday 6:30PM grade 3 and Tuesday 6:30PM grade 7. **If you are not signed up on Flocknotes, you will not receive notification about closings.** Please remember to use contact information (cell number and email) that you use regularly. All information is confidential. Others are not able to view your information. Please remember that email and text message will be sent from Flocknotes. Thanks!

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
