Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

John the Baptist was a prophet. He was a chosen messenger whose role in life was to prepare the way for God's entry among God's people. At some point he came out of the desert and captured the imagination of the people who flocked to hear him. His message was clear and direct. He told them that the long awaited day of salvation was about to dawn on them. While the main message he spoke gave hope, some of his words stung his listeners as John reprimanded them for having lifestyles which were causing them to be careless and apathetic. John cautioned the people to do penance and to reform their lives because God's kingdom was at hand. John's voice and his message continue to urge us to prepare a place for the Lord in our hearts.

Advent is an invitation to conversion and John the Baptist gives us down to earth advice on how to change our lives for the better. He speaks of filling in valleys of prejudice, leveling the mountains of pride and straightening out the crooked paths of injustice. Today is a wonderful day to examine our lives to see what needs a complete turning around in order to allow God to come close to us. The theme for the second week of Advent is PEACE. So often peace escapes people because of the dark corners that we do not want disturbed in our lives. In refusing to confront those dark recesses, peace escapes from our grasp. When peace is kept at a distance, the result is turmoil, unrest and guilt. In the life of faith, peace comes from knowing that God is with us. Peace can only come when the obstacles which prevent God from being close are removed. Preparing a way for the Lord means a readiness to walk a new path. Christ cannot save us without our cooperation.

It is only when we are ready to walk a new path that we can focus on the responsibility that each one of us has of announcing Christ to others. Our everyday life is a message telling everyone through acts of honesty, kindness, integrity and faithfulness that Christ is right here with us.

One thing that God desires for us is the experience of peace in our lives. May each one of us allow Advent to be a time of spiritual awakening so that we may have the gift of peace that has been offered to us through our Savior.

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Tuesday, December 8 is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary and is a Holy Day. Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 AM and 7:00 PM. Mass will also be live streamed. The Parish Office will be closed in observance of the Holy Day.

CHRISTMAS MASSES

It seems certain that the limitations caused by the threat of the Coronavirus will remain in place through Christmas. Of course with the limitations of the number of people that are permitted in the Church at a given time will pose challenges to be able to accommodate everyone who wishes to be present for Mass. For this year, the Bishop has given permission for Christmas Masses to start earlier than normal with the first Mass of Christmas Eve being permitted to start at 2:00 PM. The Mass schedule for this year will be different than our normal schedule. Christmas Masses will be celebrated on Christmas Eve at 2:00 PM, 4:00 PM, 6:00 PM and 8:00 PM. On Christmas morning Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM. There will not be a Midnight Mass this year. There is no way of knowing how many people will try to attend each Mass. Unfortunately, once we fill up, doors will be locked. Churches simply cannot pack people in as we have become accustomed of doing. It is advised that people plan to arrive early. To be fair, there will be no saving of seats. People will be seated on a first come, first served basis. Masses will be live streamed and we hope to use the Parish Hall for overflow, although that space is limited is well. Christmas celebrations may be different this year and even bring some challenges because of restrictions and limitations, but the Coronavirus must not prevent us from celebrating and rejoicing at the gift of the Messiah. Now, perhaps more than ever, we must hold on to the hope that God has given us by coming among us and giving us new life!

EMERGENCY HOUSING AND ADVOCACY PROGRAM - (Homeless Program) - as many of you are aware, our parish has participated in the Emergency Housing Program by hosting up to 12 men on Sunday evenings from December until the end of March. With the Coronavirus, the Board of Directors of EHAP has decided that this year they will not run the program where various Houses of Worship participate. No solution could be found to offer the program and provide safety for everyone involved. The EHAP will still be offering assistance to the homeless but will focus on a State administered program to offer assistance. They are also setting up an emergency "motel" fund that would be used when immediate assistance is not available from the State in various instances. If you would like to donate to this fund you may either send a donation to the Emergency Housing and Advocacy Program, 41 Throckmorton St, Freehold, NJ 07728. Please indicate it is for the "motel" fund. If you prefer, you may send the donation to St. Joseph Church and we will issue the check to the fund. (this keeps you off of the list used to solicit donations.)

50/50 RAFFLE

The annual 50/50 Raffle sponsored by the Men's Guild will take place on Sunday, December 13. Raffle tickets have been mailed out to parishioners. Anyone who did not receive the raffle tickets or anyone who would like additional tickets may pick them up in the Parish Office. The proceeds from the raffle will be used by the Men's Guild to help the parish and help others in need of assistance. The Men's Guild has supplied gift certificates for families in need and have most recently sponsored the purchase of equipment for our live-stream. They have also paid for some major needed repairs to the generator. Your support is greatly appreciated as the Men's Guild tries to continue to support those in need and the parish endeavors.

GIVING TREE.

It saddens me to say that I do not believe we can have the Giving Tree Program in the traditional way where you purchase gifts for needy individuals and families. Collecting and giving out the gifts this year opens us to possibly spreading or contracting the Virus. The Children's Home, has to be extremely careful so that the Virus is not spread among their residents. So, for this year, we will only do gift cards. We already have a number of families asking for help and it would be wonderful to be able to give each resident of the Children's Home a gift card (there are more than 170 residents there). If you would like to participate, just purchase a gift card and bring it in. The most beneficial gift cards for families are Walmart and Shoprite. Some families are looking for no other gift than to be able to provide food for their family. If you would like to provide a gift card for a child, the most requested gift cards in previous years have been for Amazon, Target, Kohls and Walmart. The most requested gift cards for adults have been for Amazon, Home Depot, Walmart, Target and Costco. If you would like your gift to go to a particular group (Children's Home, a family, an adult or a child), please just designate that and I will be sure that it is given to the right person. We will begin collecting the gift cards right away. This way, we will be able to give them out and parents will have the opportunity to get something for their children before Christmas. As always, we will accept monetary donations to help those who desperately need help with utilities, etc. Thanks!

DAILY MASS

We have resumed the public gathering for Mass at 9:00 AM on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday with no more than 50 people. Mass will also be live streamed at 9:00 AM on those days. If you miss the live stream, it is recorded and available to watch later on any of the sources listed under Sunday Mass above.

PARISH GROUPS

Parish groups will have the ability to have meetings in the Parish Hall. Each group will make the decision about holding meetings. There will be policies that must be followed including:

- masks must be worn by all who attend (at all times)
- social distancing must be observed
- a list of attendees must be submitted
- food will not be permitted at this time
- papers, etc. may not be handed out at the meeting. They should be sent by email and printed by each participant.
- Only one group at a time will be permitted to meet.
- Meetings must be scheduled with Fr. Mike

It is not advisable for those at high risk due to the Coronavirus to attend. If you are not well, have a fever, aches, or any flu-like conditions, please do not attend. At the present time, there will still not be any large parish events held inside since they pose a risk of exposing people to the Coronavirus. If there are significant spikes in cases of Coronavirus in the area, meetings may be suspended.

A NOTE ON MASKS

Masks are required for all events in the Church. Masks must cover mouth and nose and form a barrier. Some people have started wearing clear plastic masks that are meant for food preparation. Those masks do not meet the criteria for helping to block the spread of disease. Those masks do not form a barrier at the nose. We are adhering to the recommendations prescribed by the professionals as well as the regulations of the Diocese. Thank you for cooperating and having a willingness to protect the health of others.

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
