Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

Jesus started his preaching. He could not postpone it any longer. John had been arrested. It was time for Jesus to step in, not as a replacement, but as the fulfillment of the message that was entrusted to John. Jesus went to Galilee and started to speak. What he said seemed to be simple: "The right time has come, and the Kingdom of God is at hand, repent and believe in the Good News!"

Jesus' preaching was not in vain. His words do not fall on the ground without bearing fruit. Several people on hearing his voice and his message leave everything they have to follow Him. Some are mentioned by name: Andrew, Simon, James and John. Within a few days it was clear that the old world was disappearing and a new world was coming. The expectancy turned into fulfillment and the hope turned into excitement. The world as they knew it was passing away, all problems would be tackled and all issues would be solved.

That was two thousand years ago, among totally different people in a totally different culture, in a very small part of the world's population. The story is still told today. Yet, we have to ask does it make a difference? After all, aren't fairy tales immortal also? Are not nursery rhymes things that endure for generations?

Perhaps that becomes one of the most important choices that we have to make. Do we accept the Good News, the preaching of Jesus, the call to repentance and the invitation to discipleship as something real or just something that is nice to hear? It is nice to think about Jesus. It is nice to dream about Jesus. It is nice to have a picture of Jesus. It is nice to wear a crucifix. It is nice to watch a movie about Jesus. It is nice to have a bumper sticker with Jesus' name. However, if we are focused on what is nice about Jesus, we easily turn Him into a fairy tale. It is only when we treat the message of Jesus as being relevant for each one of us personally in our own time, in our own situations and in our own life that the Good News becomes not something that is nice to hear, but something that must be lived. Repentance, love, service, forgiveness, hope, mercy and new life cannot be something we read about, but something we must choose today if Jesus is real to us.

Dear Friends of St Joseph Parish,

For the last three years I have had the privilege of being a part of your warm and welcoming parish community.

It has been an honor for me to celebrate the Eucharist with you on weekends and weekdays and to come to know a number of you personally.

I have been so very impressed with your well-planned liturgies and joyful music. Your sense of monthly hospitality after Sunday Masses is the best I have ever encountered. I have had the chance to see your outreach in your being a part of the Hospitality network to feed and house the homeless.

For the last year I have been through a period of discernment and prayer regarding my place of residence.

When I retired from active ministry as a priest of the Paterson Diocese and moved to the shore area I did not expect to be called back up north so often. In my position as adjunct chaplain at Xavier High School in New York I have had to travel into the city very often. The wear and tear on my psyche and my car and the costs incurred have become a burden to me.

I felt it prudent for me to move back to the Diocese of Paterson and be involved in my Diocese again. I will take up residence in Rockaway township on Feb 2, 2021.

My last weekend liturgy at St. Joseph's will be the 5 PM Mass on January 30. I told Fr. Mike to hold on to my contact info and to feel comfortable to call if he needs help at times. If possible, I would truly enjoy coming back on occasion.

I thank you for the gift of your presence and support in my life these last three years and I am very thankful to Fr Mike for his sense of welcome and allowing me to be involved with such a caring parish community. **BAPTISM** – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

**Marriage** – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

**Sick Calls** – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

**Registration** – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

**Sponsor Certificates** – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
