Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

The first Reading for the second Sunday of Lent provides us with an extraordinary glimpse into the faith and character of Abraham. The command to kill his son Isaac, his only child, seems absurd to us today. God had made a promise to Abraham that he would be the father of many nations. If Abraham killed his only son, how would that promise ever be fulfilled? Even though the request was very painful, in the greatness of his faith and trust in God, Abraham quickly set out to be obedient to the divine command. In Abraham's mind, God must be obeyed at all costs. As Abraham raised the knife to slaughter his son, God stopped the final blow. Isaac's life was spared.

While the purpose of God's request was not understood by Abraham at the time, we are still able to recognize that Abraham's faith and obedience remains as an example to us today. Like Abraham, we are sometimes called into the unknown and respond to God's call with complete trust, even when circumstances make faith seem unreasonable and contrary to our human way of thinking. Abraham is one of the greatest examples of an individual who was willing to walk by faith and not simply by sight. Part of our journey calls us to grow in faith so that we believe, not because we have seen, but because of the word and power the power of God who is present in our lives.

In the Gospel story of the Transfiguration of Jesus, three of the Apostles were given a glimpse of Christ in all His glory. Their reaction was simply to believe that they were spectators of the blessed event where God revealed that Jesus was God's "beloved Son." The Apostles did not understand that they were being called to enter into a moment of divine revelation. It was to reveal to them that being obedient to the example of Jesus' life would lead them to glory. They would eventually come to understand that their paths would lead them to experience many things that were contrary to human nature and would require great trust and obedience to the way Jesus would show them.

Abraham's obedience and the message offered in the Transfiguration remind us to always be open to God, even when it seems contrary to our desires.

The RCIA is a journey of faith where people are encouraged to discern God's call in their lives. It is not a typical classroom setting. Our Catholic beliefs are introduced and explained and participants in the RCIA are encouraged to see how our beliefs, practices, Liturgies and Sacraments can have an impact in everyday situations. Anyone and everyone is invited to "come and see" to find out if the RCIA process is what you are being drawn to in your life. COVID-19 UPDATE

Due to the decrease in the cases of the Coronavirus, the number of people permitted in the church has increased. Beginning in March, we will be changing from permitting seating in every third pew to every other pew. All other policies remain in effect – masks must be worn and social distancing must be observed. We will continue to seat people and space people in the pews. It is good to see the number of cases drop, but we must still be careful so that the numbers do not climb again. There is reason to be hopeful as more people receive vaccines so let us continue to pray that we remain on the path that will put this behind us.

<u>SUNDAY MASS</u> – We do have public celebration of Sunday Mass on Saturday evening at 5:00 PM and Sunday morning at 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM. We only have one-third of the capacity in the Church. Please remember that masks must be worn and cover mouth and nose. Also, **doors are locked at the start of Mass** so that there is no need for people to wander around looking for a seat – so please arrive before Mass begins. Vimeo is the main location for the live stream.)

DAILY MASS

The public gathering for Mass takes place at 9:00 AM on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday with no more than 50 people. Mass will also be live streamed at 9:00 AM on those days. If you miss the live stream, it is recorded and available to watch later on. The links for the live stream of daily Mass are the same as those for Sunday Mass which you can find in the Sunday Mass announcement above this announcement.

PARISH GROUPS

Thankfully, the number of cases of the Coronavirus is once again dropping. It is now possible to allow groups that wish to meet to do so in the Parish Hall. All precautions remain in effect – masks must be worn and social distancing must be observed. If your group wishes to meet, be aware of the following:

- Only one group at a time can meet and all meetings will take place in the Parish Hall.
- You must contact Fr. Mike about your desire to meet
- No materials may be handed out or brought out (candles, statues, etc.
- No food is to be served
- After the meeting, a list of those who attended must be given to the parish office

A NOTE ON MASKS

Masks are required for all events in the Church. Masks must cover mouth and nose and form a barrier. Some people have started wearing clear plastic masks that are meant for food preparation. Those masks do not meet the criteria for helping to block the spread of disease. Those masks do not form a barrier at the nose. We are adhering to the recommendations prescribed by the professionals as well as the regulations of the Diocese. Thank you for cooperating and having a willingness to protect the health of others.

Covid-19 Vaccine

If you know of any seniors who may not have technology to go online, please help them to be aware of the process or help them to know the information.

As of January 14, 2021, the following groups are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine:

- Paid or unpaid persons working or volunteering in a healthcare setting
- Residents of long-term care facilities and other congregate settings
- Frontline first responders
- Persons aged 65 and older
- Persons aged 16 to 64 years old who have at least one chronic medical condition that poses high-risk for severe COVID-19:

 - Chronic Kidney Disease Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)

 - Heart conditions (e.g. heart failure, coronary artery disease, cardiomyopathies)
 - Immunocompromised (weakened immune system) due to organ transplant (consult with your doctor)
- · Obesity (e.g. body mass index of 30kg/m2 or higher)
- · Pregnancy (consult with your doctor)
- Sickle cell disease
- · Type 2 diabetes mellitus

These groups can start making vaccination appointments. More groups will become eligible in the coming weeks.

Confessions: At this time, Confessions are Offered by appointment only.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.




