Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

On this Third Sunday of the Season of Lent we are presented with a message in our second reading from Paul's Letter to the Corinthians that is very important if we are to keep seeking to be faithful to the Word of God. Paul tells his readers that that the actions and message of Jesus are a stumbling block to some and simply viewed as complete foolishness by others. Why was Jesus a stumbling block to some and rejected by others? It all comes down to the belief that they believed they knew exactly how God should act. Anything that fell outside of their own expectations, could not be of God. They limited God and, in the process, limited their own ability to grow closer to God. Paul reminds people that in comparison to God, even our strengths are no match. This is not meant to be dismissive of the good qualities and gifts that reside within each human being, it is meant to help us remain humble and open to God's direction.

If we take Paul's words to heart, we come to the acceptance that we can never give up on working on our understanding of the way of life that God calls us to lead as well as our comprehension of all that God offers us.

In the Gospel passage for today, we hear how upset Jesus became with the money changers and those selling animals as sacrificial offerings to God. Those selling, as well as those buying, were convinced that they knew exactly what God wanted. They were not at all interested in trying to understand what God wanted, what God desired for them or how God was calling them to understand the commandments. They did not understand the Temple as God wanted them to understand it. No wonder that Jesus was upset and decided to act in a way that would surely get their attention.

The Ten Commandments were not given as a list of rules in and of themselves. They were given as a starting point for maintaining a closer relationship with God. The 10 Commandments come from God and therefore contain more meaning than we can comprehend all at once.

This is why it is so important to be in an on-going relationship with God that develops, reveals more and is anything but stagnant. While we are limited human beings, God desires that we share more and more of God's life. So let us always be open to understanding more of what God offers.

### **Covid-19 Vaccine**

If you know of any seniors who may not have technology to go online, please help them to be aware of the process or help them to know the information.

PREPARED: ON JAN 13, 2021

**As of January 14, 2021, the following groups are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine:**

- ✓ **Paid or unpaid persons working or volunteering in a healthcare setting**
- ✓ **Residents of long-term care facilities and other congregate settings**
- ✓ **Frontline first responders**
- ✓ **Persons aged 65 and older**
- ✓ **Persons aged 16 to 64 years old who have at least one chronic medical condition that poses high-risk for severe COVID-19:**
  - Cancer
  - Chronic Kidney Disease
  - Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
  - Down Syndrome
  - Heart conditions (e.g. heart failure, coronary artery disease, cardiomyopathies)
  - Immunocompromised (weakened immune system) due to organ transplant (consult with your doctor)
  - Obesity (e.g. body mass index of 30kg/m<sup>2</sup> or higher)
  - Pregnancy (consult with your doctor)
  - Sickle cell disease
  - Smoking
  - Type 2 diabetes mellitus

**These groups can start making vaccination appointments.** More groups will become eligible in the coming weeks.

**BAPTISM** – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

**Marriage** – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

**Sick Calls** – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

**Registration** – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

**Sponsor Certificates** – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
