

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

All of the Readings for this Fifth Sunday of Lent point in different ways to the passion and death of Christ. Jeremiah tells the people who are being sent into exile that even though they abandoned the covenant with God, God will not forsake them. Jeremiah lets the people know that he has foreseen a time when God will form a new relationship with the people of Israel. It will be a relationship based on love and personal respect. God will put a new heart and a new spirit into God's people. On Holy Thursday we will remember that Jesus introduced the new covenant when he told his disciples that his blood would be shed for the forgiveness of sins.

The second Reading reminds us that because Jesus suffered, He can sympathize with our sufferings and help us grow rather than allowing our sufferings to crush us. Jesus understands our plight and is touched by our anguish.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks his thoughts out loud and expresses repugnance for the terrible ordeal that awaits him. Jesus is troubled at the prospect of Calvary and is tempted to pray for deliverance from such a future. However, Jesus fully understood that He must do what was necessary to allow God's Kingdom to break through. Jesus' greatest moment of influence was when he was lifted up on the cross with arms outstretched to embrace the entire world. Christ on the cross revealed the depth of evil which humanity is capable of and the heights of love to which we are called. As Christians, we are called to live out the passion of Christ whenever we face suffering, trial and distress. Agony comes to us in many different forms and in those moments we must be ready to recognize the way in which God will allow it to lead to victory. Jesus demonstrated that it is not easy. Jesus also demonstrated that when we entrust ourselves to God, even if it means accepting the cross in one form or another, God will raise us up. There are no crown-bearers in heaven who were not also cross-bearers on earth.

We now enter the last week before Palm Sunday and the start of Holy Week. It is a prudent time to examine our lives to ascertain if we have not only accepted the gift of eternal life, but also the belief that when we trust God, our own personal sufferings will never conquer us because God is always ready to raise us up.

**SOME INFORMATION ABOUT HOLY WEEK**

It will indeed be a blessing that we are able to gather for the Liturgies of Holy Week this year. Last year, we did not have that option. While progress has been made, there are still some limitations that require some adjustments for our Holy Week Liturgies.

**PALM SUNDAY –** We gather together to remember the Triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and how triumph seemed to be turned into defeat with the Passion of the Lord. It seems prudent this year that the distribution of Palms will take place at the end of Mass.

**HOLY THURSDAY –** We gather together to remember the Last Supper. The realities of what Jesus did and commanded us to do not change. This year, we will not be able to physically do the washing of the feet as is customary to remind us of the great command of service that Jesus gave us. However, it does not change the reality that we are called to serve one another. We will also not be able to process to an area of Reposition as we normally do and have people come throughout the night to sit with the Blessed Sacrament. But this does not diminish the fact the we are still called to reflect on the actions of Jesus and what He has given us.

**GOOD FRIDAY –** On Good Friday we gather to remember the Passion of Jesus. Part of the Liturgy is the Veneration of the Cross. This year we will not be able to have people come forward to touch the cross. Even without touching the cross, we are still called to accept the sacrifice Jesus made. There will still be time to reflect on the same thing.

**EASTER VIGIL -** This year we will not have the Easter Fire or the procession of everyone into the Church. We will also not have the sprinkling rite. However, we still acknowledge Jesus as the light of the world and we will still recommit ourselves to our Baptismal promises. The real focus of the Easter Vigil does not change in any way – Jesus is risen!

Indeed, some things will be different. However, the real focus of gathering together will not change. Holy Week is still holy. God still calls us to remember all that has been done for us. Maybe abstaining from some of the customs is not an entirely bad thing. Perhaps next year, when we are able to add those customs back into our celebrations, those actions will bring a renewed sense of meaning. When it comes to faith, challenges are not a new thing. While we adapt to the situation we face, we recognize that God will always be God and will lead us through the challenges to discover the new life that can only come from God.

**PALM SUNDAY** – While there will be public Masses on Palm Sunday, I understand some people are not ready to be in public settings. For those who would like palms but are not ready to be at public Mass, I will be in front of the Church at about 1:30PM to give Palms to those who want to drive up. I will stay around until 2:00PM.

**BLESSING OF EASTER FOOD** – It is tradition for some to have the food for Easter blessed. It is not advisable to have food brought into a public place. Therefore, as I did last year, I will be outside in front of the Church between 1:00PM and 1:30PM to bless food. Just drive up, open the window or pop the trunk (wherever the food is), and I will bless the food.

## **Covid-19 Vaccine**

If you know of any seniors who may not have technology to go online, please help them to be aware of the process or help them to know the information.

PREPARED ON JAN 13, 2021

As of January 14, 2021, the following groups are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine:

- ✓ Paid or unpaid persons working or volunteering in a healthcare setting
- ✓ Residents of long-term care facilities and other congregate settings
- ✓ Frontline first responders
- ✓ Persons aged 65 and older
- ✓ Persons aged 16 to 64 years old who have at least one chronic medical condition that poses high-risk for severe COVID-19:

- Cancer
- Chronic Kidney Disease
- Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
- Down Syndrome
- Heart conditions (e.g. heart failure, coronary artery disease, cardiomyopathies)
- Immunocompromised (weakened immune system) due to organ transplant (consult with your doctor)
- Obesity (e.g. body mass index of 30kg/m<sup>2</sup> or higher)
- Pregnancy (consult with your doctor)
- Sickle cell disease
- Smoking
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus

These groups can start making vaccination appointments. More groups will become eligible in the coming weeks.

**BAPTISM** – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

**Marriage** – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

**Sick Calls** – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

**Registration** – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

**Sponsor Certificates** – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
