

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

The Gospel passage for today portrays an example of the healing power of Christ in a very moving scene. A respected synagogue official by the name of Jairus, has a daughter who is so sick that she is at the point of death. In desperation, Jairus seeks out Jesus and begs that he come to heal the girl. Jesus agrees to go without hesitation, but on the way news is brought to Jairus and Jesus that the little girl had in fact died. To continue on to Jairus' house would have been pointless, but Jesus all but dismisses the news and continues on the journey to see the little girl. Jesus called for all to have faith in spite of what they were being told. Once they arrive at the house, Jesus enters the room where the girl is, speaks just two words and the child was restored to full health.

The heart of Jesus could never resist a hand outstretched in need of assistance or an appeal for help that was made in faith. While we may be fixated on the physical aspect of such healings, we should always keep in mind that Jesus intended healings to extend to both body and soul, with an emphasis on the healing of the soul. Whether Jesus was preaching, healing, debating or teaching, his priority and desire was to fill the people with the life-giving presence of God. Every act and every word that came from Jesus was an attempt to set people free from whatever bound them up with fear.

When Jesus entrusted the continuation of his mission to his followers, he also gave them the task of continuing to fill people with the life-giving presence of God. Followers in every age are entrusted with the mission of Christ. So how do go about doing that? It would be wonderful to offer physical healing to everyone who desires it. Yet, that is not the central point of our responsibility. Our responsibility to continue the work of Christ is not the physical healings but making God presence felt through our own actions. Our responsibility as disciples of Christ is to allow people to know that they are not alone because that feeling of isolation breeds fear – the fear that the individual has been forgotten, has no worth, does not matter or has to face everything alone. When we step in to offer a hand to hold or a shoulder to lean on, when we hear an individual, when we reassure them that they are loved, are important and matter that is when we allow the life-giving presence of God to set them free from their fear.

FOOD COLLECTION



Thank you for your continued generosity with the food donations during these trying months. There will always be a need for assistance with food for many people so we will continue to collect food, paper goods and toiletries in the bins inside the church entrances. After the first and third Sundays of the month volunteers will deliver the donated items to the Millstone Community Center where they are greatly appreciated and will reach those in need. Thank you again for your generosity.

BAPTISMS

As of August, we will be returning to celebrating Baptisms on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month. Up to four families will be scheduled for each celebration of Baptism. If you would like to schedule Baptism for your child, please call the parish office 732-792-2270.

BAPTISM BIBS

While the practice of giving out Baptism bibs has been suspended during the pandemic, we will soon begin using Baptism bibs again at our celebrations of the Sacrament of Baptism. If any of those who have so lovingly made the Baptism bibs can continue, that would be very much appreciated. New people who would like to make the bibs are also welcome. If you would like to see a sample, please see Fr. Mike. The Baptism bib is a symbol of the newly Baptized child putting on Christ. The purpose of having parishioners make the bibs instead of using prepackaged felt bibs, is to demonstrate that we are all connected in faith and as community. While making the bibs, many have prayed for the child who will receive it. If you have questions or just want some more information, give Fr. Mike or see him after Mass. Thanks!

ALTAR SERVERS

While we are still not at the point of being able to have Altar Servers serve as normal, we are safe to allow one Altar Server to carry the Cross in procession at Mass at the start and end of Mass. The Altar Server would carry in the Cross and then sit with his/her family and then then carry the Cross for the recessional at the end of Mass. If your child is an Altar Server and willing to do this, you may simply let Fr. Mike know when you arrive at Mass – if no one else is already doing it, then your child may do be the Cross bearer. Please note that you will have to arrive at Church early enough to give your child enough time to put on the Alb. Thanks!

LIFTING OF THE DISPENSATION FROM ATTENDING MASS IN PERSON

The Bishops of the five Dioceses of New Jersey have announced that the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation that has been in place during the pandemic will be lifted as of June 5, 2021. The following is the announcement from the Bishops:

“At this time, due to the observance of public safety protocols and the increase in the availability of vaccines, we have begun a return to some sense of normalcy in various sectors of our society.

Therefore, we the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation beginning on Saturday, June 5, 2021, and Sunday, June 6, 2021, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law canon 1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult the local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).

Finally, safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives in each New Jersey Diocese remains in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.”

COVID19 RESTRICTIONS UPDATE

MASS RELATED POLICIES

- As of June 5 (Saturday) the mask mandate will be lifted for the parish. However, please remember that the CDC guidelines are that those who have not been vaccinated should continue to wear a mask for indoor gatherings (for your protection and the protection of others who are not vaccinated). Additionally, anyone who is more comfortable with a mask, may continue to use the mask. Your choice to do so will be respected by all.
 - For at least a couple of weeks we will continue to practice social distancing at Mass. This means we will continue to seat people in every other row with separation. In a couple of weeks I will evaluate how things are going in other parishes and see if we can also change this.
 - While we are observing social distancing in the church, Communion will continue to be brought to you. Stand to receive Communion.
 - Communion will continue to be offered with the Precious Bread (the Cup will not be offered yet). Communion will continue to be offered only in the hand.
 - Priest/Deacon/Eucharistic Minister will continue to wear a mask for the distribution of Communion.
 - Priest/Deacon/Eucharistic Ministers will continue to sanitize hands prior to distribution of the Eucharist.
 - The sign of peace will continue to be offered with a wave or nod and the exchange of "Peace be with you."
 - We will continue to leave the Offertory as it is while we observe social distancing at Mass (the bread and wine will not be presented and the offertory basket will be on a table for your offerings).
 - While observing social distancing we will continue to use one door for entry into the church. You may continue to leave by any door.
 - Priest/Deacon will continue to refrain from shaking hands to greet people prior to Mass.
- All of the above policies will be reevaluated in a couple of weeks and adjusted as we go.

NONE MASS RELATED POLICIES

- Groups and Ministries may now resume meetings - Masks are not mandated, however the CDC guidelines for those who are not vaccinated should be observed. Anyone who is more comfortable with a mask, is free to do so.
- Handouts at meetings may be used.
- Food/beverages may be offered but great care should be exercised with the handling of food.

RCIA - Rite of Initiation of Adults

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is a wonderful faith journey for those who wish to be Baptized, those who are Baptized and are now interested in joining the Catholic Church and those who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation). The RCIA is a journey of faith where people are encouraged to discern God's call in their lives. It is not a typical classroom setting. Our Catholic beliefs are introduced and explained and participants in the RCIA are encouraged to see how our beliefs, practices, Liturgies and Sacraments can have an impact in everyday situations. Anyone and everyone is invited to "come and see" to find out if the RCIA process is what you are being drawn to in your life. RCIA sessions are ready to resume, although at this time the meetings will be held outdoors or via Zoom. If you are interested or would like more information, contact Fr. BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
