Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

The first Sunday of Advent is with us again and a new Church year has been ushered in. The Season of Advent has a twofold character. It is a preparation for celebrating the birth of Christ among us and a reminder of the second coming of Christ at the end of time. When Jesus was born in this world, his arrival went unnoticed by most of the people. It was only the faithful few who were prayerfully waiting for the Messiah to come who read the signs of the times correctly knew that something had happened. The Scripture Readings offer us some valuable pointers in order to be ready and prepared for the second coming of Christ. If we take the warnings seriously, then we understand that one fact remains true and relevant: all roads in life lead to the Day of the Lord. In the very busy time leading up to Christmas we can benefit from giving some consideration to who we are, what we are doing with our lives and how we are preparing for the one great test that really matters – our personal meeting with the Lord.

One of the ways we prepare for that meeting with the Lord is in recognizing that in our gathering together around the Table of the Lord we celebrate Christ's presence among us in the Eucharist. What type of welcome are we giving to Christ in our hearts as we receive Christ? The answer lies in the way we are living our lives. If we are not imitating Gospel standards in our daily lives, how do we then say that we have made room for Christ in our hearts? If we do not make room for Christ to be born into hearts, then Christ's presence has had no influence on us. Unless we make that conscious decision to welcome Jesus into our hearts we most likely have not acknowledged our need for a Savior to free us from our sins.

Advent offers us the opportunity to make a fresh start at building a closer relationship with Jesus. Even though this time of year can feel like every moment is filled with getting things done, we should take a little time to look at our lives to see what needs to be put right and to assess the ways in which we can do better. We do not have to spend huge amounts of time on this endeavor. A little time each day spent in prayer and reflecting on Gospels values can go a long way in our spiritual preparation and correcting some of the flaws that may have crept into our lives. This is how our vision of Jesus will be a driving force in our lives.



BAPTISMS

BAPTISM BIBS

While the practice of giving out Baptism bibs has been suspended during the pandemic, we will soon begin using Baptism bibs again at our celebrations of the Sacrament of Baptism. If any of those who have so lovingly made the Baptism bibs can continue, that would be very much appreciated. New people who would like to make the bibs are also welcome. If you would like to see a sample, please see Fr. Mike. The Baptism bib is a symbol of the newly Baptized child putting on Christ. The purpose of having parishioners make the bibs instead of using prepackaged felt bibs, is to demonstrate that we are all connected in faith and as community. EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS

Please sign up to serve at Mass. Now that everyone will be coming forward to receive the Eucharist again, Eucharistic Ministers will be needed at each Mass. ALTAR SERVERS

While we are still not at the point of being able to have Altar Servers serve as normal, we are safe to allow one Altar Server to carry the Cross in procession at Mass at the start and end of Mass. The Altar Server would carry in the Cross and then sit with his/her family and then then carry the Cross for the recessional at the end of Mass. If your child is an Altar Server and willing to do this, you may simply let Fr. Mike know when you arrive at Mass – if no one else is already doing it, then your child may do be the Cross bearer. Please note that you will have to arrive at Church early enough to give your child enough time to put on the Alb. Thanks!

RCIA - Rite of Initiation of Adults

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is a wonderful faith journey for those who wish to be Baptized, those who are Baptized and are now interested are interested in joining the Catholic Church and those who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation). The RCIA is a journey of faith where people are encouraged to discern God's call in their lives. It is not a typical classroom setting. Our Catholic beliefs are introduced and explained and participants in the RCIA are encouraged to see how our beliefs, practices, Liturgies and Sacraments can have an impact in everyday situations. Anyone and everyone is invited to "come and see" to find out if the RCIA process is what you are being drawn to in your life. RCIA sessions are ready to resume, although at this time the meetings will be help outdoors or via Zoom. If you are interested or would like more information, contact Fr. COVID19 RESTRICTIONS MASS RELATED POLICIES

- Masks are optional, but are strongly encouraged at this point because of the Delta variant. Those who are not vaccinated and children under 12 are more strongly advised to wear a mask indoors for both their safety and the safety of others.
- The cry room and the loft will remain closed at the present time.
- Out of an abundance of caution, the Presentation of the gifts of Bread and Wine will still be omitted.
- We will continue to use a basket at the back of the church for offertory donations instead of passing the basket around.
- The Sign of Peace will continue to be exchanged by a wave or nod with the greeting of Peace be with you.
- At the time of Communion, everyone will come forward to receive. It is advised to leave space between families/individuals of different households.
- Communion will be offered only in the hand.
- Priest/Deacon/Eucharistic Ministers will sanitize hands and wear a mask for the distribution of Communion.

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
