Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

Today, Palm Sunday, we commemorate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. The cheering crowd seem to hail Jesus as the conquering hero and even king. In reality, Jesus' entry into Jerusalem marked the beginning of a week of violent contrasts that ended in grief and glory. The palms that were waved and thrown down for Jesus to walk on would be replaced by a cross. The cheers from those who welcomed Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem would be replaced by jeers from many of the same people. Throughout the Passion our attention is focused on Jesus who appears as a person completely absorbed in prayer and the fulfillment of what he came to do.

Before his triumphant resurrection Jesus had to go through a disgraceful death. In the garden of Gethsemane Jesus was deeply troubled and even prayed that if there was another way, he would rather do that, but was ready to do what had to be done. It must have been an additional blow to find himself betrayed and taken prisoner. Jesus was mocked, blindfolded, beaten and spat upon. Jesus endured all of that while the crowd, many of the same people who had welcomed him, gave into the demands to call for a convicted criminal to go free and Jesus to be crucified. Jesus was abandoned by even his closest friends and left to endure the pain and humiliation alone. Those who longed to remove Jesus from public teaching thought that they were victorious as Jesus died on the cross.

During this most holy week of the church year we are invited to accompany Christ to Calvary, and to be silently at his side. Jesus wants the work of the cross to touch our lives, to strengthen us to break sinful ways so that we may be changed and know the love of God in a deeper way and realize what his suffering and death offers us. Jesus' passion offers us a glimpse into the mystery of suffering that surrounds us and invades our lives. In our times of suffering and trials we are given the opportunity to realize that in those sufferings we can be at one with Jesus who suffered in the same way before us.

We do know what follows Jesus' passion and death. Jesus would not be kept down. Resurrection was the outcome. Let us never forget that through Jesus, we too can share in the victory of resurrection.

Have a blessed Holy Week!

HOLY THURSDAY – MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

This Thursday, April 14, is Holy Thursday. The mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7:00 PM. This is the time that we remember what Jesus has done for us by giving us Himself in the Eucharist and also remember that Jesus did give a way to live. Let us celebrate together as a parish community.

VIGIL WITH THE BLESSED SACRAMENT



After a two-year absence, we will return to having a Chapel of Reposition set up downstairs for people to come and pray from Holy Thursday after Mass until Good Friday at 2:00PM.

On Holy Thursday (APRIL 14) we conclude the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper by transferring the Blessed Sacrament from the Tabernacle in the worship area to a Chapel of Reposition which will be set up in the Church Hall. We need to have people sign up for one hour to be with the Blessed Sacrament throughout the night and up to 2:00 PM on Good Friday. There is a sign up list on the table at the entrance of the church. If you would like to participate, sign up for the hour that you will sit with Jesus. We need at least 2 people for each hour and would prefer to have 3 people for each hour. Let us be ready to Watch and pray.

GOOD FRIDAY – PASSION OF THE LORD

This Friday, April 15, is Good Friday. This is the day that Jesus proved his love for us. At 3:00PM we gather as a Parish Community to reflect on the great act of love that leads us to redemption. Let us gather to remember, pray and be renewed in our commitment to Jesus.

GOOD FRIDAY STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Let us come together on Good Friday at 7:00PM for Stations of the Cross as we follow Jesus along The Way of the Cross. The Stations of the Cross on Good Friday are meant to be more meditative and help in placing ourselves with Jesus.


EUCCHARISTIC MINISTERS

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
