Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

I would imagine that the followers of Jesus were eager to put the trauma and disgrace of Good Friday out of their minds. Perhaps that was the reason that the Apostles slipped back to doing the things they did prior to being called by Jesus. A number of them had been fishermen so they went fishing. After a night of fishing and returning empty-handed a stranger on the shore urges them to cast their nets one more time. Reluctantly agreeing to do so, the result was a miraculous catch of fish. At that moment they recognized the Lord and accept the invitation to share breakfast with Jesus at the lakeside. In Pilate's courtyard, with curses and an oath, Peter had denied knowing Jesus on three occasions. That memory made Peter extremely unhappy. Jesus knew how Peter felt and offered Peter an opportunity to proclaim his love and loyalty to the risen Christ. Peter's ability to fulfill the role that Jesus had appointed him to, to be the leader of the community of believers, had been put in jeopardy by his denials. Jesus put things right by giving Peter the chance to acknowledge his belief in Jesus and make a confession of faith. Peter's willingness to serve was renewed and his position as head of the Apostles was clarified by Christ. Peter was commissioned by Christ to guard the whole flock in Christ's name.

The Good Shepherd leaves His people in the charge of a man who had failed, which demonstrates clearly that Christ's call does not exclude those who have fallen. Peter came to know the magnitude of God's grace through failure. It may just be the case that sometimes failure may be the finger of God pointing the way, awakening within us an awareness of our own helplessness. Whatever it was about that encounter at the lakeside, it restored Peter's confidence, gave him strength to renew his faith and propelled him into the spreading of the Gospel.

If we desire to stay true to our own Baptismal calling, we too must be willing to allow Jesus to ignite our faith so that we do not define ourselves by the failures of life. God does not exclude us because of our falls however, we can exclude ourselves whenever we refuse to allow Jesus to act.


MEN'S GUILD

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
