Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

Today's Gospel reminds us of the end of time by drawing our attention to the last moments of Christ's earthly life. Jesus was crucified on the cross between two thieves, for claiming to be king, yet the only crown he wore was braided with thorns. Over his head was written, 'Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews.' Only a few of his family members and followers were faithful to the end. At the moment of his greatest human agony he welcomed the repentance of one of the thieves who hung beside him. Jesus gave the repentant thief the personal assurance and guarantee of eternal life as he said, 'Today you will be with me in paradise.'

While earthly kings rule from palaces, Christ the King rules from the cross. Christ's kingdom is not a place but a people who give their hearts lovingly to him by shaping their lives according to God's laws and the message of the Good News. All that is good and elevated in our human nature flows from Christ's willingness to hang on a cross and won for us the opportunity to have eternal joy with God. By accepting death on the cross, offers us a signpost to heaven and the road to be followed if we are to make sense of our lives and open up the vision of a new world.

For those who have lost sight of the truth that heaven is our final destination, the Feast of Christ the King invites us to start living our lives as Jesus taught us to live them. In all we do, we are called to seek to grow more like Christ, for he becomes our king only when we give him our allegiance. In practice we often withhold that loyalty. How many can truthfully say that Christ is the head of the household, the unseen guest at every meal, the silent listener to every conversation and the number one priority when we choose where our energy and time will be dispersed? If Christ is truly our King, he cannot be given simply our leftovers. Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe must be the first priority. If we do that, everything else is given a better perspective. If we allow Christ to be our king, the one who rules over our hearts, we can be assured that we will be with Him in paradise for eternity.




FOOD COLLECTION

Confessions: At this time, Confessions are Offered by appointment only.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.


