Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

Given his situation, John the Baptist could hardly be blamed for wanting to confirm the true identity of Jesus. John's outspokenness in front of King Herod earned him imprisonment in a dungeon and the prospect of death. In his prison cell John had been hearing stories about the peaceful behavior of Christ which did not fit his own expectations of a stern Messiah ushering in an age of fiery judgment.

Anxious to find out if Christ was the promised one for whom he had prepared the people by his preaching, john sent his messengers to Jesus with the urgent question, 'Are you the one who is to come or are we to await someone else?' The reply given by Jesus indicated that his ministry was one of healing, and life-giving. The deaf were hearing, the blind were being given sight. People were beginning to experience new life and the poor were receiving the Good News that God was on their side. John would not be slow to draw the conclusion from such an answer that Christ was indeed the long awaited Messiah. John could face death with the assurance that his own life had been meaningful and worthwhile.

The Gospel poses the question of our own acceptance or rejection of the person of Jesus. The question voiced by John has relevance in every age and is of importance to us, because the basic requirement for entry into the Kingdom of God depends on welcoming Jesus and placing no obstacles to his working in our lives. Advent is a wonderful time to assess what impact or influence Jesus has on our behavior by reviewing in our minds and hearts the values that are reflected in our actions.

For those who would truly welcome him, Jesus demonstrated compassion for their past sins. Jesus offered understanding for their bruised soul and the wounded heart. This is what Jesus wants us to realize. Jesus is ready to offer us what we need if we truly welcome and accept Him, the way of life that he calls us to live and accept the gifts that come from Him to give us strength. The best gift we can offer ourselves at Christmas is an open heart for the one who came to bring new life.

PRAY FOR ONE ANOTHER DURING ADVENT






FOOD COLLECTION

Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.


