Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

One of the main criticisms that is often levelled against church-goers is that Sunday worship has little influence on their weekday lives. While it is true that in truth, church is for sinners and not saints, we should not use that as an excuse for failing to do our best to incorporate our Sunday worship into the rest of the week. While we are all sinners, we cannot avoid or ignore our responsibility to experience an ongoing conversion. In other words, we must give sincere effort to overcoming our weaknesses.

Otherwise, our worship does become pure lip-service and not something that comes from the heart.

Jesus tells us in our Gospel passage today that getting by within in the letter of the law is not what he has in mind for his followers and spells out clearly what he expects of all who profess to believe in him. Jesus does not lay down rules and regulations for every situation in life but he asks us to evaluate our motivations. Thoughts are just as important as deeds. What we say and do must express what is in our hearts because good attitudes (motivations) produce sincere actions. Anyone can easily perform outwardly good deeds to impress others, but God is never so easily fooled by such action. Jesus gives the Commandments a much deeper meaning by stating that they are written into our hearts and the innermost part of our being. The Commandments are a blessing from God and a sign of God's care for us. The Commandments are for our own welfare and give us the means to achieve inner freedom. If our goal is to merely avoid breaking the Commandments, then we are not trying to be closer to God but simply fulfilling the basic minimum that we believe is required for salvation.

Some of Christ says can seem harsh but when we give the matter serious thought we see that Jesus is offering us the way to find real satisfaction. True satisfaction and happiness will never be achieved through a half-hearted commitment, especially when it comes to our relationship with God.

Our approach to life should always be based on doing what is pleasing to God rather than doing what we are simply obligated to do. We will not be judged on the evil we avoided but on the good we have carried out.



RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults





Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.


