

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

This Wednesday, February 22, is Ash Wednesday and the start of the Season of Lent. Lent is a time where we are called to give some special attention to spiritual growth and renewal. During this period of time leading up to Easter and our celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, we get to make the choice to do those things that will help us experience the kind of on-going conversion that will draw us closer to God, open our hearts and minds to acknowledge how we need to change and prepare us to be drawn into the Resurrection of Jesus.

How do we do that? The Church has taught for many years that Lent is a time to Fast, Pray and Give. These are all practices that put us closer to the way of life that Jesus calls us to follow. **Fast** from those things that become an excess – it is not just food. We may benefit from a bit of fasting from: accumulating more stuff; spending too much time playing video games; watching too much television; gossiping about others; surfing the web to find artificial pleasure. If something we are doing is preventing us from live living as children of God, it is good to fast from it, not simply as a sacrifice, but as the start to a permanent change.

Prayer is always important. During Lent we are called to pray more. Pray for: those who need to be lifted up; those who need to find God; those who are alienated or estranged; ourselves; the world. Pray for a greater openness to be guided by the Holy Spirit. Pray for the wisdom to understand our individual roles in God's plan for salvation. Pray to be able to avoid being misled by the temptations that are so rampant. Pray to draw closer to God.

We are also called to **give**. Giving does not apply simply to giving money. It means giving of ourselves. Giving means adopting a way of life where self is not the center of existence. Jesus taught his followers to give of their time, give of their talent, give of their resources, but most importantly, to give from the heart.

Lent is not about doing something for the sake of doing it, it is about doing something that will bring about the change that opens us more to God.

ASH WEDNESDAY



Wednesday, February 22 is Ash Wednesday and the start of the Season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday Christians have their foreheads marked with ashes as a sign of commitment to enter into the Lenten Season with the intention of undergoing change. On Ash Wednesday, Mass will be celebrated at 9:00AM, 5:00PM and 7:00PM. The imposition of ashes will take place at each Mass.

LENTEN SOUP NIGHTS AND STATIONS OF THE CROSS



Lenten Soup Nights are returning. Join us on Friday evenings of Lent for a simple meal of soup, bread and beverage. Lent calls us to step back and do those things that will help us recognize the benefit of enjoying simple events and at the same time, do things that will offer help to others. The idea of our Lenten Soup nights is to replace our regular Friday meal with the simpler meal and then, if you wish, to donate what that meal would cost to those in need (the donation is optional, but helps us to at least think about Jesus' command to

care for others. There will be a donation box present and all the money collected during Lent will go to a food pantry. Sign-up sheets for parishioners to sign-up to bring soup on the first two Friday are posted on the large bulletin board in the vestibule of the Church (meatless soups for Fridays of Lent). So, mark your calendars for the Fridays of Lent so you remember to join us. Soup nights are followed by Stations of the Cross. The meal begins at 6:30PM followed by Stations of the Cross at 7:30PM.

PRAYING FOR ONE ANOTHER DURING LENT



Prayer is important. Lifting one another up in prayer is a true blessing. This Lent we will offer everyone the opportunity to pray for each other. On the Wednesdays of Lent you are invited to pause at 7:00PM to pray for all parishioners. At that same time, others will be praying for you as well. By stopping at a certain time, we are united in prayer as a community of faith, no matter where we are. On the Wednesdays of Lent an email will be sent to remind everyone pause at 7:00PM to pray. The email will include the parish prayer for Lent. Of course if you do not wish to participate, just hit the delete key for the email. Last year I was told of a number of instances where children of the parish actually looked forward to the brief time of prayer and became the reminders for the adults when it was time to pray. So, let's lift one another up and be lifted up in prayer.

LENTEN REGULATIONS FOR CATHOLICS


Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE. The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.
2. Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat): this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat). The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

PLEASE NOTE, The Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton has given a dispensation from abstaining from meat on Friday, March 17 (St. Patrick Day) however the practice should be transferred to another day that week.

NEW LECTOR TRAINING



Lectors proclaim the Word of God at Mass. Would you like to serve as a Lector? To serve as a Lector you should be at least 14 years of age, have a clear speaking voice and be willing to prepare to proclaim God's Word prior to coming to Mass. RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is a faith journey for those who wish to be Baptized, those who are Baptized and are now interested in joining the Catholic Church and those who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation). The RCIA is a journey of faith where people are encouraged to discern God's call in their lives. It is not a typical classroom setting. Thank you to everyone who supported the bake sale last weekend. Thanks to your generosity and support it was a huge success. Special thanks to all who donated treats for the bake sale.


BAPTISMS

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Parents are asked to register for a Baptism Preparation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
