Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

God's ways of seeing are not our ways, we hear in today's First Reading. Jesus illustrates this in the Gospel as the blind man comes to see and the Pharisees are revealed as the ones who are truly blind.

Of course, the blind man stands for all humanity. "Born totally in sin," the blind man is offered new life and is made into a new creation by the saving power of Christ.

Just as God fashioned the first human from the clay of the earth, Jesus gave the blind man new life by anointing his eyes with clay. As God breathed the Spirit of life into creation, the healing of the blind man was not complete until he washed in the waters of Siloam, a name that means "Sent."

Jesus is the One who was sent by the Father to do the Father's will as witness to what all who follow the will of the Father can expect. He is the new source of life-giving water where, in Baptism, we encounter the Holy Spirit who rushes upon us and offers to guide us.

This is the Spirit that rushes upon God's chosen king David in today's First Reading. A shepherd like Moses before him, David is also a sign pointing to the good shepherd and the king to come—Jesus. In the Psalm for today, we proclaim that the Lord is our shepherd. By His death and Resurrection Jesus has made a path for us through the dark valley of sin and death, leading us to the verdant pastures of the kingdom of life as it exists in this world.

May we never forget that in the restful waters of Baptism God has refreshed our souls. God has anointed our heads with the oil of Confirmation and spread the Eucharistic table before us. God has given us every good thing. Along with the once-blind man we are invited to continue to build the Kingdom of God here and therefore, give God the praise and renew our trust in God each and every day.

The Lord looks into the heart, we hear today. Let Him find us, as Paul advises in today's Epistle, living as "children of light," trying always to learn what is pleasing to our Father and offering God praise with our lives.

EASTER EGG HUNT/GIFT BASKETS



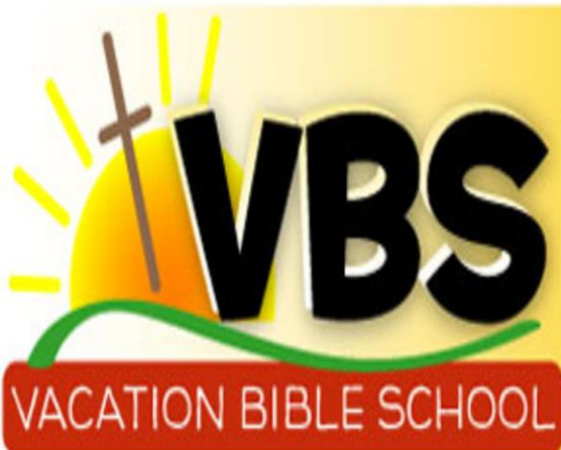

FOOD COLLECTION

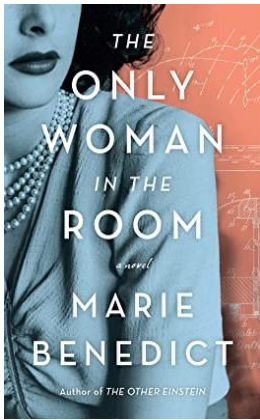

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
