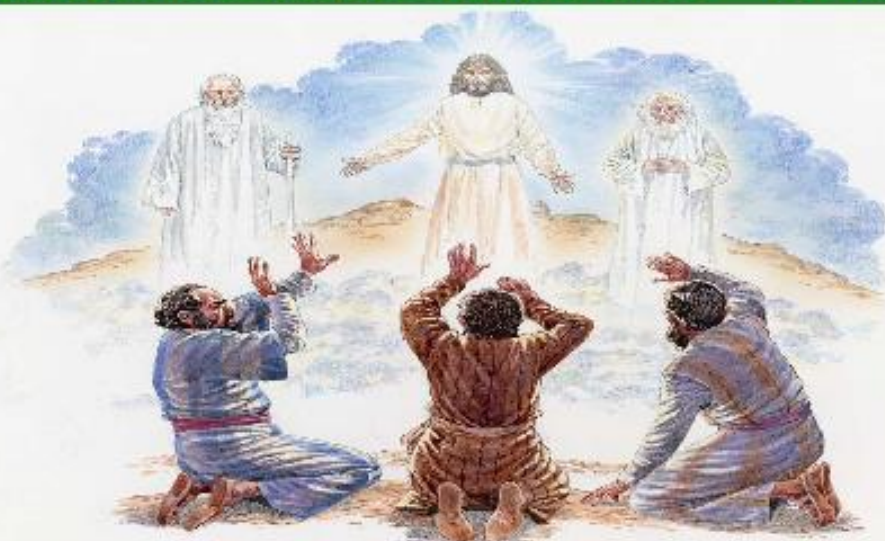

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

A few of the Disciples were blessed to witness the Transfiguration of Christ. They saw the dazzling appearance of Jesus as he spoke with Moses and Elijah. The disciples trembled in fear as they heard the voice of God proclaim, "this is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Just as fast as the vision came, it was over. The glimpse of Christ's real personality was over and it was time for them all to return to the realities of life.

The purpose of the Transfiguration was to make the chosen Apostles aware of the divine presence in the man with whom they walked, ate and talked. If there was any doubt in their minds prior to walking up the mountain, there should have been no doubt on the way down the mountain that Jesus was the Son of God. In witnessing the Transfiguration of Christ, the disciples were also given a taste of future glory. However, it was also meant that they were being prepared for the humiliation of the Passion. When they first chose to accept the invitation to follow Jesus, little did they realize the price they themselves would be asked to pay.

We all learn the lesson of life that anything worthwhile is seldom easy or straightforward. The message of the Transfiguration is that there is a connection between suffering and glory, death and resurrection. When the road is long and things get difficult it is good to remember that there is no short cut to glory. Real happiness and peace of mind only come after Calvary because the cross and suffering are inescapable.

The Transfiguration reveals the gradual process of change that takes place in our lives when, like the Apostles, we accompany Christ on the road to Calvary. It reminds us that we can easily become absorbed into everyday concerns of living that we may lose sight of the end to which we have been called. At times we are weighed down with feelings of failure and worthlessness but suddenly a piece of good news brings sparks of joy, a bit of hope or a reminder that we are loved and our outlook changes and we see our lives in a better light. The transfiguration offers us the opportunity to allow the glory of God to shine in our lives.

BISHOP'S ANNIVERSARY BLESSING 2023

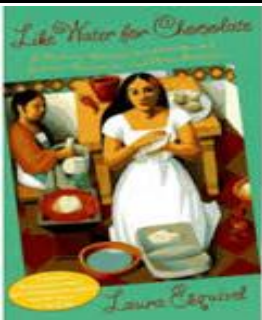

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
