Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

Peter found it extremely difficult to accept that the mission of Jesus would end with the cross and crucifixion. He did not see why pain and suffering were necessary for discipleship and, if he could have his way, would have Jesus avoid such a course of action. Peter was very upset at the idea that the Messiah would experience such a humiliating ordeal. Like many before him and many after him, Peter failed to grasp the role of suffering in God's plan. Peter thought that being part of the kingdom and accepting the invitation to be a disciple of Christ would somehow coincide with the earthly understand of power and success. Peter found it very challenging to let go of his preconceived idea that the Messiah would reign in splendor and glory. Even though Peter had witnessed it and heard Jesus speak about it, Peter still wanted those who held on to power to be overthrown by a Messiah who would give the oppressed what they could only dream of, prosperity and privilege. Even though Peter already made a magnificent profession of faith in Jesus as the Son of the Living God (what we heard in the Gospel last week), he had quite a way to go in his understanding of the kind of Messiah that Jesus would be. In almost every way, Jesus would prove that the way we think is not necessarily the way God thinks.

Many may face the same kind of challenges that Peter did when it comes to our understanding of God. Very often we find it hard to let go of our preconceived notions about what God should do for us. If we are faithful people, why do we suffer? If we believe that Jesus came to bring us salvation, why is life sometimes so challenging and filled with hardships? Being a Christian is demanding work exactly because God's way of doing things is not always in line with how we want things done. The measure of being a true disciple of Christ is found in our willingness to trust Jesus in the most difficult of times, in the painful times and in the times that make us feel helpless. Do we believe that there is more to our lives than what we experience in this world? Do we believe that Jesus has prepared a place for us in His eternal kingdom? Do we believe that while God's ways may not be our way, God's way is the best way?


EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS

Confessions: Confessions take place on Saturdays after the 5:00PM Mass or anytime by appointment.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
