

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

The Readings for Mass today highlight the theme of repentance. Jonah, a reluctant prophet, was sent to preach a message of repentance to the Ninevites, the sworn enemies of Israel. Jonah had no enthusiasm for that job and was annoyed with God for squandering God's mercy on the enemies of Israel. Jonah would have preferred to see Ninevah destroyed rather than giving the people of Ninevah an opportunity to be converted. However, God thought otherwise. The people were important to God and worth giving a new opportunity. To Jonah's great dismay, when he preached, the people listened, changed their ways and the city was spared. God's call to repentance is based on God's love and respect for us. It is an affirmation of our basic worth and that in God's eyes, we are valuable. Unless we are gripped by this feeling of being worthwhile objects of God' love, we will miss the point of the Gospel's call to conversion.

There is something striking about the Apostles' response to the call of Jesus. Those called obviously had the realization that something better was being offered to them. They sensed that Jesus was calling them to a higher way of life and they were able to see themselves, not as they were, but as they could be. To such an invitation there could only be one response: to repent and believe the Good News. There is more to repentance than saying a few extra praying, doing some time fasting or being sorry for past sins. The Gospel tells us that, just as those called to follow Jesus had to leave everything behind, we must be willing to leave those things and ways that take us away from God or prevent us from drawing closer to God.

The call to repentance and conversion must be an on-going desire on our part if we desire to draw closer to God. When we sin, we prevent ourselves from being who God calls us to be. When we repent and seek true conversion of heart, we open ourselves to realizing that something better is waiting for us. God constantly calls us to conversion because God believes we are worthwhile and capable of reaching new potentials. Jonah's message holds hope for us. The Gospel message encourages us to see ourselves as more than we have been – to respond to a higher calling. God's mercy is available to all who seek it. When we seek that mercy, it can change our lives.

**Format:** Video presentations 1 hour, followed question/discussion period. Background material, bible references, and discussion questions will be provided to participants before each session.



Confessions: Confessions take place on Saturdays after the 5:00PM Mass or anytime by appointment.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
