Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

We would have to be living the life of a hermit to close our eyes to the pain and suffering that exists in our world and in the day to day life around us. Our hearts would need to be made of stone not to be moved by a friend's marriage coming to an end, a child with a serious medical problem and the heartbreak that is so common for many in daily life. The grim pictures of war, famine, children dying of starvation can shake the faith even of a saint. So many conclude that all the suffering is a punishment from God or that because such suffering exist, there is no God. There is no absolute understanding of why good people suffer or must endure such heavy burdens. For some, their confidence in God is shaken because of the suffering that exists.

The Book of Job is an attempt to come to grips with the problem of suffering in a brutally direct way. Job is a good person, a person of faith and he is put to the test. He loses his wife, family all of his possessions and finally is struck down with ill health. He is so overcome that he feels there is nothing to live for but misery. For all of Job's deliberations as to why so much suffering came upon him, Job does not come up with any convincing answer to the meaning of his present situation. The truth is that there is no easy answer. Job was no the first person, nor the last to be baffled by the problem of suffering. Illness and death can be the most trying times of our lives. Some people neglect God until the great challenges and pain of life are thrust on them. It is only then that they turn to God for answers and help but they hear nothing and conclude that they have been forsaken.

It is extremely important that we nurture our relationship with God so that when suffering hits, we do not feel that God is absent or nonexistent, but that even in our suffering we know that God is with us. That is what allowed Jesus to endure the suffering on the cross. We do not understand why there has to be suffering but, with a deep trust in God, we believe and know that whatever happens to us, all things work together for those who love God and share in the passion of Christ. Nothing in the Word of God guarantees our freedom from suffering but gives us the assurance that God is with us however great our suffering may be.

Format: Video presentations 1 hour, followed question/discussion period. Background material, bible references, and discussion questions will be provided to participants before each session.



Confessions: Confessions take place on Saturdays after the 5:00PM Mass or anytime by appointment.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
