Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples in pairs to go ahead of Him into every town and place He intended to visit. These are not the Twelve Apostles, but a wider circle of followers. This tells us something powerful: the mission of Jesus is not just for a chosen few, but for all who follow Him. Every disciple is a missionary.

Jesus' instructions are clear and urgent. He tells them the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few. This was true then, and it is just as true today. We look at our world and see so many people hungry for meaning, direction, peace, and love—hungry for God. But how few are the workers who go out to share that Good News.

He also warns them that they are being sent out “like lambs among wolves.” In other words, discipleship is not always safe or easy. It takes courage, humility, and above all, trust in God. They are to travel light, depend on the hospitality of others, and bring peace wherever they go.

When the seventy-two return, they are full of joy: “Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name!” They are discovering the power of Christ working through them. But Jesus redirects their joy—not toward the power they wield, but toward the grace they have received. “Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you but rejoice because your names are written in heaven.”

This is the heart of the Gospel: our joy does not come from success or influence or power, but from our relationship with God. What matters most is not what we do for Jesus, but who we are in Him. There are three key takeaways from this Gospel passage: We are all sent. Whether we're at home, school, work, or in ministry—each of us is sent to prepare the way of the Lord. We are called to bring peace. In a world of division and fear, we are messengers of healing and reconciliation. Our true joy is in belonging to God. The deepest peace we have is not in what we accomplish, but in knowing our names are written in heaven.

So let us go out, like those seventy-two, with courage and simplicity, bringing the Good News, trusting that Christ goes with us and works through us.

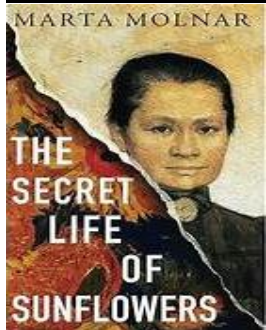
### FOOD COLLECTION

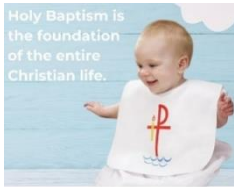

**BAPTISM** – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

**Marriage** – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

**Sick Calls** – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

**Registration** – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

**Sponsor Certificates** – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
