

Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, Jesus is asked by one of his disciples, "Lord, teach us to pray." This simple request leads to one of the most treasured gifts we've received from Christ: the *Our Father*, the Lord's Prayer. In just a few lines, Jesus teaches us how to turn to God not as distant ruler, but as a loving Father who provides, forgives, protects, and leads.

Jesus begins by saying, "When you pray, say: *Father*..." That one word changes everything. He doesn't instruct us to begin with lofty titles or grand language. Instead, He brings us into intimacy with God. We are not beggars trying to convince a reluctant deity. We are beloved children speaking to a caring and attentive Father. Our prayers are not transactions—they are conversations grounded in relationship.

In teaching the prayer, Jesus highlights our daily dependence on God: "Give us each day our daily bread." This is not just about food, it is about everything we truly need each day: strength, grace, patience, healing, and wisdom. Jesus reminds us that God is not a vending machine who gives us what we want, but a Father who gives us what we need—even when we don't fully understand it.

Jesus goes on to tell a parable about a man who persistently knocks on his friend's door at midnight. The point is not that God is annoyed into acting, but that persistence matters—not because God is reluctant, but because prayer shapes us. It teaches us to desire rightly, to wait humbly, and to trust deeply. "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened." This is not a formula for guaranteed results, it is a call to confident persistence. Sometimes the answer is "yes," sometimes "not yet," and sometimes "I have something better." But always, the Father is listening.

Jesus ends this teaching with a powerful promise: "How much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him?" When we pray, the greatest gift God gives us is not merely what we ask for—it is *Himself*. His Spirit dwells in us, transforms us, comforts us, and gives us the power to live as Christ did.

So, when we pray, let us not worry about saying the right words or having the right feelings. Let us simply go to the Father who knows us, loves us, and never tires of hearing from us. Like children who run to their parent's arms, let us ask, seek, and knock with bold trust—because we know who is on the other side of the door.

Lord, teach us to pray. And give us the faith to never stop.



BAPTISM BIBS



At the Sacrament of Baptism for infants, a white Baptismal bib is given to each child as a symbol that they have been clothed with Christ. We have been blessed with parishioners who have lovingly made the bibs. This gives it a special meaning since they come from members of the community. If any of those who have so lovingly made the Baptism bibs can continue, that would be very much appreciated. New people who would like to make the bibs are also welcome. If

Confessions: Confessions take place on Saturdays after the 5:00PM Mass or anytime by appointment.

<u>BAPTISM</u> – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

<u>Marriage</u> – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

<u>Sick Calls</u> – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

<u>Registration</u> – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

<u>Sponsor Certificates</u> – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
