Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

The Gospel passage we hear today is one of the more surprising parables Jesus tells. We might expect Jesus to say: *“Don’t be like the dishonest steward.”* But instead, Jesus says, in effect: *“Learn from him.”* Learn what? Jesus is not praising dishonesty. He is praising **foresight, resourcefulness, and decisiveness**—qualities that often serve people well in business or politics—but here Jesus is urging His disciples to use those same qualities for **eternal life**.

The steward in the parable is about to be fired. Faced with a crisis, he takes stock. He knows that he will not survive manual labor, he is too ashamed to beg—so he does something clever: he reduces the debts of his master’s debtors so they will welcome him later. He uses his present power to prepare for his future. Jesus’ point: *If worldly people are so shrewd about money, why aren’t we as wise about our souls?* The stakes are infinitely higher. Yet we can be careless about prayer, stewardship, forgiveness, and eternal life.

The steward’s mistake was not only dishonesty, but it was also forgetting that he was managing someone else’s property. In the same way, **everything we have—our time, our gifts, our money, even our very life—is on loan from God**. We are managers, not owners. Someday God will ask for an account of our stewardship. The parable invites us to ask: *What am I doing with what God has entrusted to me?*

Jesus says: *“Whoever is faithful in very little is faithful also in much.”* Think about the small decisions we make: Do we pray daily, even briefly, or let the day pass? Are we honest in our work, or do we cut corners? Are we generous with the little we have, or stingy with even great wealth? Faithfulness begins in the little things. These daily habits shape our souls, so that when larger challenges come, we respond with integrity.

Then Jesus says the line we know so well: *“No servant can serve two masters ... You cannot serve God and mammon.”* Mammon means not only money but everything that can become an idol—success, power, popularity. When we try to serve both, one will always win. It is not that money is evil. Money is neutral. But money makes a terrible master and a wonderful servant. If we use it as a tool for generosity, for the support of our families, and for the Church and the poor, it becomes holy. If it controls us, it becomes our master and corrodes our soul.

This Gospel is not meant to condemn but to awaken us. Jesus is telling us: you have so much potential! Be bold, be creative, be decisive about your eternal future. Just as an athlete trains for a race or a businessperson plans for retirement, a disciple prepares for heaven by using earthly resources to build God’s kingdom.

At the end of the day, the parable comes down to a choice: **Who is my master?** We cannot serve both God and mammon. But we can serve God **with** our mammon—our money, our time, our abilities—by placing them all at God’s service. Then, when our stewardship on earth is over, we will be welcomed, as Jesus says, “into eternal dwellings.”

May the Lord give us the grace to be wise stewards, faithful in little and in much, and wholly devoted to God, our true Master and treasure.



OCIA – RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS




The first session of the OCIA will take place on Sunday, September 28 at 10:00AM in the meeting room at the back of the Parish Hall.

The OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults – *formerly known as the RCIA or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*) is a faith journey for those who wish to be Baptized, those who are Baptized and are interested in joining the Catholic Church and those who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation). The OCIA is a journey of faith where people are encouraged to discern God's call in their lives. It is not a typical classroom setting. Our Catholic beliefs are introduced and explained and *participants in the OCIA are encouraged to see how our beliefs, practices, Liturgies* and Sacraments can have an impact in everyday situations. 
CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD



CHOIRS, CANTORS AND MUSIC MINISTRY





BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
