Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

As we begin the season of Advent, we are invited into a time that is beautifully simple yet profoundly rich. Advent is often called a “season of waiting,” but that phrase only scratches the surface. Advent is a season of awakening, expectation, and preparation, time not only to look forward, but to look within.

There are three movements in Advent. First, we look back to Bethlehem, to the humble night when God entered our world as a child. In remembering Christ’s first coming, we rediscover the tenderness and humility of God. Secondly, we look forward to the day when Christ will come again in glory. Advent reminds us that our faith is not nostalgia; it is a living hope. Jesus will return, and our lives should be ready to meet Him. Finally, we look within to the places in our own hearts where Christ wants to be welcomed. Advent is not merely a countdown to Christmas; it is a spiritual check-in where we are called to ask Where does the Lord want to be born anew in my life? What needs healing? What needs changing? What needs surrender?

In a world that rushes toward Christmas with lights, noise, shopping, and stress, Advent offers us something different: a holy pause. Advent teaches us that God works slowly, gently, and in hidden ways. The Messiah grew quietly in Mary’s womb for nine months. John the Baptist prepared in the silence of the desert. And the Savior arrived in the middle of the night, unnoticed by the world. Advent invites us to slow down enough so that God can catch up to us.

Hope is more than optimism. Optimism is believing things will get better. Hope is believing that God is with us even if things do not appear to be getting better. Advent hope is stubborn hope. It lights a candle in the darkness and says: “Christ is coming. And that is enough.” When life feels uncertain, when the world feels unstable, when our hearts carry burdens—Advent tells us: “Lift up your heads. Your redemption is near.”

Preparation in Advent reminds us that while we decorate our homes, we need to also decorate our souls. John the Baptist tells us to “prepare the way of the Lord.” This means that we need to focus on smoothing out the rough ways of our sin, clearing out the clutter of our distractions, making space in the inn of our hearts where Christ so often finds “no room.”

Here are some suggestions you may consider to prepare your heart for Christmas: pray a simple Advent prayer every evening, choose one room or area to keep uncluttered and quiet, before going to bed ask yourself “Where did I see Christ today?”, drive without the radio once a day, visit someone lonely or homebound, perform a secret act of generosity each week, choose one evening a week with no screens and fill the silence with prayer—not more activity.

Advent is a gift. It is God giving us time. Time to breathe. Time to pray. Time to hope again. Let us enter this season not by doing more, but by receiving more—more grace, more peace, more Christ.

May our hearts become the manger where Jesus finds a home this Christmas.



PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY



BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
