Some thoughts from Fr. Mike...

Dear Friends,

There is something very human about the story of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. They are walking away from Jerusalem—away from hope, away from community, away from what they thought would be their future. They are discouraged, confused, and disappointed. In their minds, the story of Jesus is over. And yet, without them realizing it, Jesus is already walking beside them. That is the first lesson of this Gospel: Even when we feel lost, discouraged, or confused, the risen Lord is closer than we think. He comes quietly. He listens. He walks with us.

Notice how Jesus approaches them. He does not scold them. He does not immediately reveal Himself. Instead, He asks a simple question: "What are you discussing as you walk along?" He invites them to tell their story—to share their pain, their disappointment, their shattered expectations. Sometimes, that is exactly how the Lord works in our lives. Before He explains anything, He listens. He lets us speak. He meets us where we are.

We can probably relate to those disciples. There are times in life when we walk our own "road to Emmaus"—moments when plans fall apart, prayers seem unanswered, or the future looks uncertain. We may wonder, where is God in all of this? The answer of this Gospel is simple: He is walking right beside us, even if we do not recognize Him yet. Then something beautiful happens. As they walk, Jesus begins to explain the Scriptures to them. He helps them see that God was at work all along, even in suffering and death. Later, they will say, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He spoke to us on the way?"

That phrase—"hearts burning within us"—is a sign of the presence of God. It happens when the Word of God touches us, when truth suddenly becomes clear, when hope begins to return. But the most important moment comes at the end of the journey. They invite Him to stay:

"Stay with us, for it is nearly evening." And then, at table, Jesus takes bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it to them. In the breaking of the bread, their eyes are opened. This is not an accident. Saint Luke shows us the pattern of every Mass: First, the Scriptures are explained. Then, the bread is broken. And in that moment, Jesus is recognized. The same risen Lord who walked with the disciples on the road to Emmaus walks with us here. He speaks to us in the Word.

He reveals Himself in the Eucharist.

Notice what happens after they recognize Him. They do not stay in Emmaus. Even though it is late, even though the road is long, they immediately return to Jerusalem. Their sadness turns into joy. Their fear turns into courage. Their disappointment turns into mission. That is what an encounter with the risen Christ does. It changes us. It sends us.

So perhaps the question for us today is simple: Where is my Emmaus Road right now? What disappointment, worry, or confusion am I carrying? Because this Gospel assures us of something very comforting: You are not walking alone. Christ is already beside you. He is speaking to your heart. And He is waiting to be recognized—in the Word, in the Eucharist, and in the ordinary moments of your life.

And maybe our prayer today can be the same as the disciples: "Stay with us, Lord." Stay with us in our doubts. Stay with us in our struggles. Stay with us on our daily walk. And when we recognize Him, may our hearts burn with faith, and may we go out with joy to share the Good News.

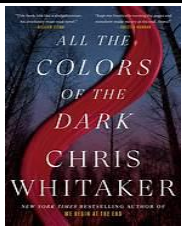

OCIA – ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

BAPTISM – The Sacrament of Baptism is normally celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:30 PM. Baptisms must be scheduled in advance by calling the Parish Office. Sponsors must obtain Sponsor forms from their home parish – Sponsors must be active practicing Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Marriage – Diocesan policy requires that arrangements for Marriage be made one (1) year in advance of the wedding. Refer any questions to the Pastor.

Sick Calls – Please contact the Parish Office when someone is seriously ill requiring a visit by a Priest. If someone is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis and would like to receive Communion please call the Parish Office

Registration – We are glad you are here and want you to feel like a full member of the parish. Registering as a parishioner helps us to know who you are and to stay in touch. Registration is required for sponsor forms.

Sponsor Certificates – This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Confirmation. To receive a form, the following is required: -Be a registered, active (attends Mass) member of the parish (for at least 6 months); be at least 16 years of age; must have completed the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation; If married, have a valid marriage within the Church.
