THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Today the Church is celebrating the Baptism of the Lord, the Feast which concludes the liturgical Season of Christmas. This mystery of the life of Christ visibly demonstrates that his coming in the flesh is a sublime act of love by the Three Divine Persons. We can say that from this solemn event the creative, redemptive, and sanctifying action of the Most Holy Trinity will be increasingly evident in the public ministry of Jesus, in his teaching, his miracles, and in his Passion, death and Resurrection. We read, in fact, in the Gospel according to St Matthew that "when Jesus was baptized, he went up immediately from the water, and behold the heavens were opened [for him] and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and alighting on him; and lo, a voice from heaven, saying, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased'" (Matthew 3:16-17).

NEARBY DROP-IN CENTERS: HELP AVAILABLE 24/7

At this time of year in the cold, it is particularly heart wrenching to see a person on the street in our neighborhood. We sometimes question whether money for a meal will go for the intended good purpose. We want to help, but often are at loss as what do to.

We should be aware that immediate relief is available in our neighborhood. There are two nearby centers open twenty-four hours a day where someone can drop in to get out of the cold, get a meal, and a shower.

Within our parish is The Grand Central Neighborhood Social Services' Main Chance Center located at 120 East 32nd St. (bet. Park & Lexington). A little further west is Urban Pathways' Antonio Olivieri Center at 257 West 30th St. (near Madison Square Garden between 7th & 8th Aves.). Both are open 24/7.

These centers meet an immediate emergency need for a place where someone can literally come in out of the cold. While these centers do not immediately solve long-term difficult problems, they can help an individual to take steps in the right direction. We have all experienced the resistance of individuals to receiving help (and not only those on the streets). Sometimes individuals prefer the cold of the sidewalk

because of fear or other reasons. It can be frustrating and sad. However, we should not stop reaching out to offer help. Maybe one day, with the help of God's grace, it will be accepted.

PRAYER VIGIL FOR LIFE

The Church has designated 22 January, the anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, as a day of prayer for the protection of the unborn and penance for sins against the dignity of the human person. A Prayer Vigil for Life will take place on Wednesday, 22 January at St. Patrick's Cathedral, beginning with a Holy Hour led by the Sisters of Life at 6:30 p.m. and concluding with Mass at 7:30 p.m., celebrated by Cardinal Dolan. All are welcome.

ORDINARY TIME

"Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays. This period is known as Ordinary Time" (Universal Norms, 43). Ordinary Time begins on Monday, 13 January and continues through Tuesday, 25 February, the day before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten season. It will resume when the Easter season ends, Monday, 1 June, the day following Pentecost.
