**The month of October** is dedicated to the holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary. If the Rosary is not part of your prayer routine, perhaps you would consider saying it once or twice a week. There are plenty of valuable resources online which provide the necessary how-to if you are unfamiliar with how to pray the Rosary or if you've been out of practice.

4 October is traditionally the feast of **St. Francis of Assisi**. Due to the pandemic, we are unable to have our annual blessing of animals. However, we can still pray for our pets:

Blessed are you, Lord God, maker of all living creatures. On the fifth and sixth days of creation, you called forth fish in the sea, birds in the air, and animals on the land. You inspired St. Francis to call of them his brothers and sisters. We ask you to bless the animals and all living creatures. By the power of your love, enable them to live according to your plan. May we always praise you for all your beauty in creation. Blessed are you, Lord our God, in all your creatures! Amen.

Next weekend in Assisi, **Carlo Acutis** will be beatified. Born in London in 1991, Carlo was an Italian and raised in Milan, and developed a deep love for the Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin Mary. He used his computer skills for the purposes of evangelization. After developing leukemia, Carlo offered his final suffering for Pope Benedict, and, after his death in 2006 aged 15, worked miracles. Carlo is a saint for our times, someone who used computers and the internet not for his own benefit, but for Christ. His relics are displayed in Assisi for veneration, wearing his favorite sneakers.
