**Mass Intentions:** It has been a long-standing tradition in the Church for people to schedule a public Mass for a specific intention. The intention may be for someone who has died or for the living: recovery from illness, to mark an important milestone in life. The scheduled Mass sets aside a date and time that the Mass will be celebrated allowing family or parishioners to join in the celebration. The schedule information appears in the parish bulletin and the intention is included in the Universal Prayer at Mass. The standard donation for the scheduled Mass is \$15 which can be arranged through the parish office during business hours. For a donation of \$2 one may purchase a Mass Card to share the information with the family. Currently, there are many available openings for scheduled Masses.

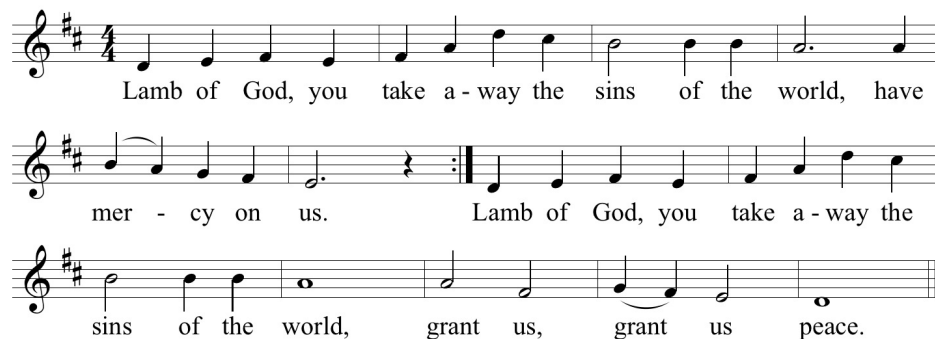

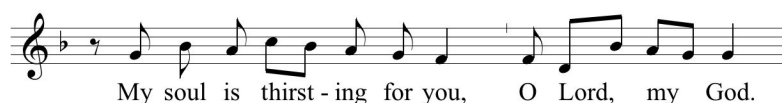
