**Dear Parishioners:**

I know that many of you have met Virginia Hill, our lay pastoral associate. I am pleased that she is present at the Masses to informally greet you. Please feel free to speak with her and share with her any of your ideas and interest for building our parish faith community.

Let me give you one example of how already Virginia has been helpful. One of our parishioners was about to undergo serious surgery. The parishioner spoke with Virginia, and we arranged for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick before surgery. Thanks be to God the surgery went well.

This is a good opportunity to ask you to let us know if there are any parishioners who do not get out and would like communion brought to them at home. We would be happy to arrange that.

We have begun the process of auditioning and interviewing for Paul Murray’s successor as organist and music director. We have some fine candidates who we expect will be able to continue the fine legacy that Paul leaves and build on and enhance that foundation going forward. No decision yet, but I am confident we will reach one shortly.

Let me mention two commitments that I have in the next two weeks that will take me out of the parish for a few days in the middle of both weeks. This upcoming I will be in Puerto Rico at the SOMOS Conference of NYS Hispanic elected officials to host of day of service sponsored by Catholic Charities on Wednesday, give the invocation on Friday, and celebrate Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday afternoon.

The following week of November 7, I will be on a retreat on Long Island that Cardinal Dolan asked all the priests of the Archdiocese to take part in. I will be praying for you. Please pray for me.

### **Covid-19 Vaccines, Mandates, & Religious Exemptions**

A few people have come to the parish office inquiring about a religious exemption from the various vaccine mandates that are in place. Pope Francis and Cardinal Dolan have been clear that there is no moral problem with Catholics receiving the vaccines. Furthermore, Cardinal Dolan has been direct in his communication that the clergy of the Archdiocese of New York are not to provide letters supporting a person's claim of a religious exemption based upon the Catholic faith. Pope Francis spoke in a very different supportive tone: "being vaccinated is an act of love...a simple, but profound way of promoting the common good and caring each other especially the most vulnerable."

**Young Adult Professionals' Ministry:** The Church of Our Saviour and the Chapel of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary is starting a **young professionals' ministry**. Young professionals seeking to grow in friendship and faith through prayer, service, and social events are invited to join. We believe a faith-filled community is vital at this time of your life as you pursue holiness in your studies, work, and relationships with others. We will observe our usual daily Mass schedule both days (see *bulletin cover*).

### **Popes and Presidents:** This past Friday, October 29,



President Joe Biden was received in an audience with Pope Francis. While this is not the first time that the two have met, it is the first time that they are meeting since President Biden has held the office of President of the United States.

The first president to meet with a pope was Woodrow Wilson, who met with Pope Benedict XV, before the Vatican was a sovereign state. Forty years later, Dwight D. Eisenhower traveled to the Vatican to meet with Pope John XXIII (see *picture above*). John F. Kennedy, the first Catholic President of the United States met Pope Paul VI in July 1963, just weeks after Paul VI's election to the papacy and almost five months before Kennedy's assassination.

Lyndon B. Johnson and Paul VI had a meeting at the Walford-Astoria hotel on Park Avenue when Paul VI visited the United Nations in October 1965. Richard M. Nixon met with Paul VI at the Vatican in 1969 and Gerald Ford met with Paul VI in 1975.

Pope John Paul II met Jimmy Carter in 1979, when John Paul II became the first pontiff to visit The White House. During his pontificate, Pope John Paul II met with Ronald Reagan, George H.W. Bush, Bill Clinton, and George W. Bush.

Pope Benedict XVI met with George W. Bush at the Vatican and at The White House during the papal visit to the United States in April 2008. Benedict hosted Barack Obama at the Vatican in 2009. Obama met with Pope Francis in 2014 and in 2015, when Pope Francis visited The White House.

Donald Trump visited the Vatican once in 2017 and met with Pope Francis.
